Welcome to the Sutton Poyntz Open Gardens 2015. We have a wide variety of gardens for you to visit, as well as refeshments available at the Mission Hall in the village. Thank you for visting us today.

The gardens listed below are marked on the map overleaf and also with a blue flower outside each garden.

- 1) 75, Sutton Road A five-year-old garden with shrubs and herbaceous plants set around a gravel path and approached by 14 steps from a terrace with pot plants.
- 2 1, The Puddledocks The old barn is nestled in the corner of an old dairy yard. Its open front is laid to lawn, but beside the house is a tiny courtyard garden enclosed by brick walls and beech hedging. There are fruit trees and a small raised vegetable bed.
- 3, The Puddledocks An informal garden that suits a rural village with native plants wherever possible. This garden is child friendly.
- 4, The Puddledocks Large garden divided into the formal garden of flower beds, lawn and fish pond and the fruit and vegetable area accessed via a pergola bridge
- The Cottage, Puddledock Lane Cottage-style organic garden that welcomes our wildlife visitors. Planting favours spring and early summer flowers. Deep pond and steps.
- Old Bincombe Lane Take a leisurely stroll up Old
  Bincombe Lane and pause in the dappled shade of mature
  trees to enjoy the differing styles of carefully-tended front
  gardens.
- Southdown Cottage, Plaisters Lane A plant lovers' garden full of cottage garden favourites.
- 8 Corner Cottage, Plaisters Lane A bijou cottage-style garden, with some box topiary and a pond. Access to the garden is down six steps, to the rear of the house.
- 2, Sutton Court Lawns This garden has evolved over the years according to circumstances and time. Recent retirement will hopefully mean many more happy hours available to spend in it.

- **Springside**, Plaisters Lane Built in 1930, with some of the original fruit trees in a third of an acre plot. A mainly self-sufficient garden with open views towards the White Horse.
- Valley Cottage, Plaisters Lane two acres of gardens, part formal with a large meadow. Vegetable plot, pond and beehives.
- Hillside, Plaisters Lane A garden for the family, with space to camp, barbeque and play badminton. All with a lovely background of wonderful views.
- (13) Keston, Plaisters Lane An informal natural garden with a variety of fruit trees. Lovely views to the hillsides.
- Wyndings, Plaisters Lane An English Country Garden, gently sloping with mature trees and shrubs. Floriferous tubs, large perennial and grass borders planted to encourage wildlife. Vegetable beds and fruit trees with a small pond .All situated on the site of a Roman kiln complex with a feature left for viewing.
- Mission Hall For refreshments and stalls.
- 1, Waterworks Cottages A small, attractive south-facing garden bordered by the River Jordan. There is a family-friendly lawn and borders filled with spring and summer cottage flowers. Enjoy!
- Northdown Farmhouse, Sutton Road Large informal gardens with views along the valley to the White Horse and towards Osmington
- (18) The Mill, Sutton Road (to be seen from both sides only). An elevated garden on the banks of the mill leat on one side and bounded by the millstream on the other side.
- Overcombe Barn, 100, Sutton Road -Spacious garden with wonderful views towards the White Horse. Perennial beds with recentlyplanted grasses. Vegetable area, fruit trees and large lawn.

All gardens are open to guide dogs.
