This disease is almost universally spread throughout the village. Many trees are dead and a great many more are showing signs of the disease, which is spread by root contact as well as the boring beetle. There is no cure for the disease: injection has proved expensive and ineffective. The only course available is to remove all trees so affected. There is no financial assistance from the County Council or Weymouth and Portland Borough Council, but advice can be obtained from the latter. The Society would like, if money can be raised, to assist with replanting and your Secretary has a list of trees recommended. We hope to arrange for a Barbeque to be held in the garden of the Springhead Hotel on the 12th July next year and any profit made will be earmarked for this purpose.
