In these parts we are fortunate to have no serious water problems but nevertheless replenishment of the underground aquifers is essential and wastage of water is to be deplored.

THE RIVER JORDAN Recently the Borough Engineer reported to a Council committee on complaints received about the general condition of the village river, blocked by silt etc. An undergraduate student has been employed on vocational training to progress further the river's land drainage scheme. Included in the work is the collation of a schedule of riparian owners who will be asked to maintain their section of the watercourse; if those requests prove unsatisfactory, a further review will be undertaken.

In addition, it is hoped that a computer model of the existing catchment, with channel calculations and outline solutions, will be sufficiently advanced to enable a technical report to

be submitted to the N.R.A. by the end of the present financial year.

WEYMOUTH RELIEF ROADS ORDERS We have received a copy of the case which Dorset County Council has prepared in support of its views on these matters; a local public inquiry is expected to be held by the end of the year. The SPS Committee has submitted a counterstatement to the County Council and the Ministry of Transport, urging once more that the Brown Route be abandoned. .

TRAFFIC CALMING - SUTTON ROAD AND PLAISTERS LANE Representatives of the Society have discussed this matter with the Borough Engineer. Excessive speeding by many vehicles is a serious problem. Measures proposed on behalf of the Society were:

* rumble pads to be created at the most dangerous points;

* warning signs should be provided at the extremities of the roads, pointing out that there are no pavements and careful driving is essential; in the case of Plaisters Lane, the "extremity" should be where it joins Coombe Valley Road;

* a 20 mph limit should be imposed along the whole length of the roads;

* weight restriction signs should be more effectively sited;

* random police radar speed checks should be implemented.
