PLANNING MATTERS

A planning application Ref 97/599/FUL dated 10.12.97 has been submitted on behalf of Mr Philip Seal to build a large barn on Sutton Farm, close to Puddledock Lane. The building will be 1,860m² (i.e. over 60 metres long and 30 metres wide) and rise to 6.1m at the eaves. It is intended to construct the building of green coloured metal cladding and the roof will be of grey asbestos sheeting. This monstrosity will sit on a concreted area of 5,000m².

The Society has lodged a strong objection to the proposed development on the grounds of adverse visual impact and the increased danger of flooding in an area already susceptible to it.
