THE POND

Last year the condition of the pond gave cause for concern and the Society instituted a series of discussions with the Weymouth and Portland Borough Council, the Dorset Wildlife Trust and the Environment Agency to investigate the best way of protecting this central feature of Sutton Poyntz. It was agreed that, if nothing was done, the pond would deteriorate and possibly become silted up. Sides of the pond were in danger of breaking down, causing the destruction of the habitat of the protected water voles.

As a result of this co-operation, work has already started to remedy the problems and to enhance the interest of the pond for local people and visitors. The Wildlife Trust has commissioned work to provide 'spikes and faggots' to enable the planting of pond-side plants to take place, thus providing protection for the pond edges; this part of the project should be completed later this Spring. WPBC will manage the willows around the pond P.T.O.
