#### **PLANNING**

Camping – Weymouth and Portland Planning Department have not progressed any further with their deliberations on the appropriateness of an Article 4 directive. Photographic evidence of the impact on the AONB has been provided to assist them. Following a query about the state of the latrines we understand that the facilities have been properly run and there are no environmental health issues associated with the camping this year.

Planning Applications – your committee commented on the application to build a house on the land opposite Wyndings. In fact two comments were made; the second corrected the first and pointed out those areas where the application conflicted with the Society's published policy.

Applications on trees are usually left to the Tree Officer. The Council have been informed of felling that may have required authorisation.

The new stable in the land off Plaisters Lane is not a fixed building, has no floor or foundations, and therefore does not require planning permission.

CPRE – Peter Jones reports that the CPRE have urged the Government to rethink the wording of the Localism Bill in so far as it relates to planning. Peter points out that the Weymouth and Portland Plan currently under review is central to the new planning policy. The Society is participating in the preparation of this plan which is required to specify development sites to be valid. Peter's full report is on the village website.

Road Gritting - Last winter, Sutton Road was closed by snow and ice for a short period, preventing the bus from running. Hazel Bruce and Brian Ellis (our local Borough and County councillors) have been asked to make the case for the gritting lorry to divert off the Preston Road and clear the bus route. Just a ten minute diversion would keep the bus running. Failing that, and very much as a second best solution, we have asked for grit bins to be provided so that residents can take matters into their own hands. We also contacted Christine James councillor responsible for highways) who is taking the problem on for us. Things seem to be moving so hopefully we will see the bus running through the winter.

Village Spring Clean – Would you volunteer to help tidy up the village in the New Year? This will involve the litter collection as previously but also some clearance of undergrowth on the banks and verges.
