#### Homewatch

Peter Jones attended the AGM of the Dorset Association of Homewatches. Martyn Underhill, the Dorset Police and Crime Commissioner, is committed to improving community policing via Homewatch. Community Speedwatch, part of the police No Excuse campaign, is also being introduced, where communities set up a monitoring body for their speed restricted roads. These groups will receive specialised training, initial police supervision and loan of monitoring equipment. The performance of the 101 non-urgent police reporting number has caused many complaints; this, and Ringmaster messaging, is being reviewed. More special constables are being recruited but not for use in the police neighbourhood teams.
