The end of an era

Joyce and Freddie Litschi were founder members of the Sutton Poyntz Society and it is perhaps the end of an era now that due to increasing frailty they have moved out of the village. After leaving training college Joyce taught in Leamington Spa. Always



adventurous, she took a Cooks Travel Company tour of Switzerland, where she met Fredi - born in Germany with a Swiss mother - in Lucerne. Married in 1947 they moved to Streatham where Joyce became a deputy headmistress and Fredi worked in retail in the

West End. They 'retired' to Camelot in Sutton Road in 1966. Joyce taught part time in the children's section of Dorchester Hospital, was President of Weymouth Operatic Society and served with distinction on Weymouth and Portland Borough Council for 17 years, becoming Mayor in 1980. Fredi, himself a Dorset County Councillor, supported Joyce in all she did. They were founders of the SP Players and performed in many Thomas Hardy plays. Fredi wrote a very popular booklet about the village, and even adapted Hardy short stories into plays, donning a very fetching smock to appear on stage in these! Their daughter Isolde Martyn, who is an author of note, her husband John and married granddaughter Claire live in Australia. Homewatch

The Association of Dorset Homewatches AGM was addressed by the Deputy Chief Constable of Dorset, James Vaughan. He said that, shed break-ins apart, the overall crime rate in the county is falling but budget cuts and the need to make significant savings over the next year mean that Dorset police will have to "do less with less". There will be reductions in some front line staff, cuts in support functions and a review of expenditure. However he emphasised that operational tasking will be met and that with improvements in communications and procedures the officers on patrol will foster the decreasing crime rate. More Special Constables will be recruited and the number of Police and Community Support Officers (PCSOs) will not change. He stressed that the Chief Constable and the Police and Crime Commissioner are committed to the furtherance of community Homewatch Groups and another 34 had been created in the County during the year.
