Size of Committee: - Mr Sauphier felt that it should be

possible should be assigned a small duty so

first, and that the setting up of Working Parties &
sub-committees might be left until a later meeting,
although names could be taken at the inaugural
meeting of any willing helpers & a note made of
in what capacity they could assist.

The Chairman would ask the assembly whether it was their wish to form a Society & would ask for a suggested membership fee.

No mention or decision would be made regarding the joining of the C.P.R.E. or Civic Society. This must be left to the newly elected Committee to decide. Membership fee to be kept as low as practicable possible.

Mr Langhies would stress the point that natives of the village should take part in the running of the Society. He did not wish them to feel that it was being done entirely by outsiders.

He agreed that tact would be necessary as questions might be asked which touched on personal grievances rather than with development or planning.

Mr Pusswell hoped that something could be done about letters during the summer season.
