

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at the Springhead Hotel on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May. Mr Sampier in the chair. Apologies were received from Mrs Macdonald and Councillor Taylor. All other members bar Mr Hunt were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

#### Matters Arising

No letter of assurance had as yet been received from the Deepmouth Council regarding the removal of the island should it prove unsatisfactory after twelve months. Mr Hitchcock promised to ring Mr Houseago's secretary on this matter. Green Patch outside Mr Haller's cottage. The Secretary was requested to write to the County Land Registration Authority to find out whether it be registered.

New development in Plaister's have - Mr Reed said the site lines denoted good access, but Mr Branton maintained that it was essential to keep an eye on it when development commenced.

#### Brouse Chapel

Mr Betschi reported that he had called on Miss Guppy and she had promised to discuss the matter with her agents, Messrs Duke of Dorchester. Mr Betschi later had contacted them but was informed that Miss Guppy did not wish to let out the chapel. The committee was disappointed at her decision and the secretary was asked to write Miss Guppy stating in what ways the Society wished to make use of the chapel and to renew the request.

Letter to Bus 600 - The Sec. had phoned the Bus Office but they could give no information as to curtailments of services as the new Time Table did not come out until June 2nd. The Sec. was asked to write respecting the promised winter curtailment and ask for a skeleton winter Sunday service to the village.

#### Meeting with Borough Engineer

The chairman regretted that he had not mentioned affiliation to the C.P.R.E. at this public meeting. Mrs Shires asked that the affiliation go ahead - subscription £1 guinea - and this was agreed upon. A vote of thanks was made to Mr Newland & Mr & Mrs Shires Lewisic Society Affiliation - The Secretary had written Mr Walmley Lewis but had not as yet received a reply.

Members Enrolment Subscriptions In response to the Secretary's request for lists of new members so that a full list could be compiled, Mr Fullford and Mr Reed said that they had not been able to enrol new

members. Mr Fullford said that he had no intention of doing so, and Mr Reed expressed dislike of going from door to door without a subscription card. Mr Sampier had not brought any names along. Mrs Macdonald was absent from the meeting. Mr & Mrs Shires & Mr Litschi produced lists of new members.

#### Bank Account

It was agreed that a bank account be opened with Lloyds Bank, Dorchester.

#### Future Programme

Mrs Shires proposed that a "History of Sutton Payntz" evening be arranged. Mr Litschi suggested a village social. Both these suggestions were approved & it was decided to hold the social in July and the history evening in the autumn. For the purpose of arranging & organising the social an Entertainments Committee was formed consisting of Messrs Stilwell, Shires, Litschi & Reed. The Secretary mentioned that she had had a chat with Mrs O'Brien of the Dorset County Council, who had recommended that a letter be sent to the clerk of the County Council concerning the proposed Power Station at Portland, asking that should planning permission be applied for by the Central Electricity Board, the Society be immediately informed. The Committee agreed that this should be done.

Regarding the island in the pond, regret was expressed that nothing had as yet been planted on it. Mr Branton was asked to contact Mr Saville about this. Once more the wish was expressed that ducks be put on the pond once more.

Letter Heading, Mr Litschi had had a block made

depicting the pond and cottages. This was shown to the Committee who expressed approval. Mr Hetschi said that a member Mr Phillips had asked whether the Society could preserve and mark out the footpaths. Mr Henshaw promised to approach Mr Burchenough, a member of the Society, who was reputed to know a great deal about this. The date of the next meeting was fixed for Friday June 28<sup>th</sup> and there being no further business, the chairman declared the meeting closed.
