Matters Arising

It was agreed that a member be co-opted

Regarding the ducks Mrs Walden had offered her services as duck feeder but it was agreed that the matter be left in Mr Saunders' capable hands.

Mrs Morris had had much difficulty & delay over the licensing of the Scout Hall. It was agreed that the ticket charge be 4/6. Mrs Morris reported on the organising up to the present and names of likely helpers were put forward.

Conservation Areas

The Society was invited to send a representative to a Tree Conference at the Weymouth Training College on Sat. Oct. 4th. Fee was 25/- It was felt that a member should attend & Mr Litschi agreed to do so.
