Matters Arising

Pond Seepage - The Sec. was asked to remind the Pres. Engineer of this problem once again.

A.G.M. - it was deplored that a greater number of people had not attended though it was a very wet cold night which might have been the reason.

re. Conservation

Subs Mr Litschi & Mr Saunders to divide members into areas for collection of subscriptions by Committee.
Conservation Mr Shires informed the meeting that the whole tempo had changed & the Society's suggestions had been much welcomed by the County Authority, and one of the Planning Officers had suggested that the area be larger, and had asked the Soc. for suggestions as to the boundaries.
In discussion it was agreed that mature trees be planted, that the hillsides formed an essential part of the village, and that the farm & Puddledock Lane be conserved. It was felt that it was essential that a Sub-Committee be formed for any future plans concerning Conservation.

A.G.M. Findings

The field containing the young bulls was not a listed footpath, therefore no right of way. The Sec. would inform Mrs Read of this. The rubbish in Puddledock Lane would be investigated & Mr Colquhoun be approached for more specific details.

- Mersenucia - to be placed wherever Sec. thought
most fitting.
