

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at 3, Silver St
on Friday April 2nd, 1946 Mr Shires in the chair.
Apologies from Mr Mullins, Mr Litchi, Mr Hackett Jones,
Mr Sampier and Mrs Morris.

Minutes of previous meeting were read - Mr Brown disapproving
the reference to his meeting young Mr Diment re footpaths.
The remainder of the minutes was adopted.

Matters arising - the blotting out of three Spows was
depleted. The Sec. promised to enquire further into the
matter.

Yellow lines. Sutton/Presta Rd Junction

The Secretary explained that objections had been raised
by users of the Scutt Hall to the extension of the
double lines as far as Verlands Rd junction on both
sides. She had therefore amended this extension to
the boundary of Scutt Hall / Box Tree Cottage garden on
the west side. She feared that if no amendment
were made the whole of the extension might be refused.
Conservation The Chairman exhorted that we keep
an eye on the progress made in this direction
at County Hall.

Footpaths

Mr Saunders stated that the footpath had been
restored on Mr Diment's land but Mr Parker's land had
been ploughed for some years & the footpath had not
been reinstated. Mrs Shires suggested a leaflet
be produced denoting footpaths. This to be available

to members & visitors - a supply to be kept at the "Springhead"
Mr Shires would produce a map & would check the footpaths
over Mr Pocher's land, then if required, a polite note could
be sent to him about it.

A. G. M. - April 16th

Mrs Shires had procured a film "Between the Tides", which
would be shown at 8.30 p.m., It would last about 20 mins.
The election of officers was discussed and Mr Shires
expressed the wish to stand down from the Chair,
Mrs Litschi agreed to continue as Secretary, with Mr
Lauders as Treasurer if the members so wished.
Future Programme Suggestions.

Mr Cox thought the National Film Library could be
contacted for the hiring of films and Mr Brown
suggested Mr Jones, Senior Lecturer of Dorset Agricultural
College as a possible speaker.

The Skittles Match v. Osington should be left to the
new Committee.

Any other Business

Mrs Litschi suggested flowers ^{or fruit} be sent to Mrs Janshurd
who had been very ill in hospital. This was agreed
& it was left to the Sec. to discover when she would
be coming home.

The Pond verge & seepage was discussed, It was
felt that the solution to the seepage problem would
be to seal the wall internally with cement. The Sec.
agreed to discuss this with the For Engineer. The verge
had narrowed considerably owing to the heavy
lorries passing. The wire mesh needed cleaning
but members felt that they could deal with this
themselves.

The Sec. informed the meeting that the annual
C.P.R.E. subscription had been increased to £2.
There being no further business the meeting was
declared closed.
