

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at 3 Silver Street
on Thursday 29th August, 1946. Mr. G. Hitschi in
the chair.

Apologies were received from Mrs M. Whennett and
Messrs Wright and Cox.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and
approved.

Matters Arising:

Mrs Hitschi reported that there are already two
litter bins in use near the pond. She had noticed
that the litter problem had not been so acute during
recent weeks but agreed to keep the matter under review
and to ask the Council to provide a 3rd bin when
the financial situation improved.

Correspondence. The Secretary read letters from the
Electricity Board and the Post Office regarding the
undergrounding of wires round the pond. These
letters were handed to Mr. G. Shires for consideration
and action by the Conservation Sub-Committee.

Mr. Hitschi reported that a letter had been received
from the County Librarian in which he said that
the photograph, programme & script of the recent
production of the Grummet Major will be retained
permanently in the Hardy Collection at the Library.

Pond. It was reported that although the work carried out by the Weymouth Engineers Dept in June had improved the appearance of the pond, there is still seepage. Mr. Saunders offered to organise a small working party to repair the wall. Materials to be provided by the Society. He also offered to provide & care for several ducks.

Mrs Hotschi offered to arrange for the fish to be replaced in the pond next Spring.

The Committee agreed that the sum of £20 promised to the Weymouth Canal by the Society towards the cost of ^{the installation of the water meter} repairs should now be paid.

Sutton Payntz Society Benches.

As the residents of ^{or} Bincombe Lane are against the idea of a seat being placed on their land it was agreed that a bench should be placed on the high ground on the North side of Planters Lane behind "Wayndings". Mr. Saunders gave permission for this to be done with the proviso that should he give up the land at some future date, the seat be removed if the new tenant so desired.

Mrs Morris offered a seat from her own garden to be used in conjunction with another one to be provided by the Society and placed near the pond with the permission of Weymouth Council.

Xmas Cards. A view of Planters Lane was shown to the Committee. It was agreed that this card was not altogether successful and that Mr. Litschi obtain another a drawing from another artist for submission to the next meeting.

, Tea on the Lawn A successful event was held in the garden of 'Greendown' Planters Lane on 6th July. The weather was good and about 40 members attended. The sum of 84/- realised from the sale of surplus food was handed to the Treasurer by the Secretary.

A letter of thanks was sent to Mrs. Burrough.

Play.

The Chairman reported that a meeting was held at the Mission Hall on 2nd August to discuss a new production. 'The Yalpuddle Martyrs' was considered but certain difficulties regarding royalties have arisen. The Chairman is continuing with his enquiries with a view to this play/film being performed by the History & Drama Groups.

Ladies Walk. This was held on 21st June. Twelve ladies took part. Mr. Sanders conducted the walk on a pleasant evening. The participants were joined by their spouses at the Sun Ray Hotel.

Archery

Mr. Shires enquired as to the possibility of an Archery

Club being formed by the Society as a number of children in the Village are interested. After discussion it was agreed that Mr Shires should make the necessary enquiries & report to the next meeting.

Notepaper

The Committee agreed that the chairman should order 400 sheets of headed notepaper for the use of its Secretary.
Pottery findings at Bab Cottage.

The Chairman reported that pottery and a Roman grave had been found in the garden of the above house. These items have been sent to the Dorset County Museum.

Preston Playing Field

Mrs Hirsch gave a report on the Preston residents' fight to keep this an open space. After discussion it was decided that whilst members were sympathetic, no active assistance could be given in this matter.

The Society would display any notices etc. but it was up to individual members to decide what action they would take.

Old Bincombe Lane Development.

In view of the purchase of Snuffy Cottage by Mr. Dainton James it was decided that Mrs Hirsch should be asked to keep in touch with the Weymouth Planning Authority and when an application for planning permission is received by them, to request that permission be

granted with a recommendation that a small piece of land be left free for use as a children's play area. This information to be included in the next newsletter, also a request for views from the residents of Old Bincarke Lane.
