The Minutes of the last meeting were read & approved.

Matters Arising.

Bench. Mrs J. Hitschi read a letter she had received from the Borough Engineer giving permission for the necessary arrangements to be made for the Bench to be placed as in the sketches submitted by Mr. G. Shires. The Chairman agreed to obtain information and prices & consult with Mr. Shires later.

Pond Members of the Committee had removed the offending weeds, but very quickly, more had appeared.

Mrs Hitschi reported that she had discussed the matter with the Chief Engineer of the Borough & that he had promised to inspect the pond in the near future and give advice or take action, whichever he considered necessary.

The Chairman reported that suitable letters had been sent to Mr. Hawkins & Mrs Barter on the death of their spouses.

There was some discussion as to whether flowers should be sent from the Society on these occasions but the Committee decided against it.

The Chairman reported that the Hatice Board was deteriorating & in need of renovation. The Secretary was asked to contact Mr. John Harrison for advice.

Band for Social Evening on 22nd November 1945.

Mr. Litsdir was authorised to book a Band & report on the cost to the Committee.

Dutch Elm Disease.

Mrs Hitschi reported that some money was available from the County Council & Weymouth & Portland Borough Council for the treatment of trees affected by the disease. It had been suggested that as not nearly enough money was available, the Society might like to make a contribution. The members felt that if trees in our area were in need of treatment, we might consider making a contribution, but that we would not make a ~~general~~ grant for general use.

Strategies for Weymouth.

Mrs Hitschi reported that a meeting of local Associations was being arranged to discuss this document. She will advise members when the date is arranged in case any Committee members would like to attend.

Plans for improvement of 104 & 109 Sutton Road.

The Committee inspected these plans submitted by Mr E. Sanders, who reported that one objection had been received by the Council. This was an objection to the roof which would, it was said, take light from a neighbour's house.

Mrs Hitschi asked Mr. Sanders to prepare a list of relevant points which she could raise with the Planning Officer.

Mrs M. Brown reported that the old garage owned by Mr Parkhouse was in bad condition and as it was situated at the entrance to our village, gave a bad impression to visitors.

Other members mentioned the old Catholic church used by Mrs Pitman for the storage of hay & owned by her Gypsies.

After a long discussion it was decided that Mrs Hirsch should report these two buildings as eyesores to the appropriate Officer of the Council.
