

Minutes of a Committee meeting held at 3, Silver Street
on Wednesday 3rd Sept. 1945.

There were no apologies for absence.

Before the start of the business meeting the Committee received a deputation from the Bincarke Lane Residents namely, Mr. Ingham & Mr. Scott.

Mr Ingham outlined the correspondence & dealings he has had with the Chief Executive of the Weymouth & Portland Borough Council regarding the completion of building & ^{the} landscaping of the site. He asked the Society for support in this matter.

After the deputation had left the Committee discussed these issues at some length & decided that whilst they had every sympathy with the residents they felt that the matter was ~~now~~ being dealt with adequately by Mr Hinchliffe & the Planning Office & Committee.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read & approved.

Matters Arising

Bench Mr Wherrett reported that a relative may be able to obtain a bench as per Mr. Shires' sketch

at a reasonable price. She was asked to obtain details & report later.

Pond

Mrs Hitschi reported that the Chief Engineer of the Borough had examined the weeds and that in his opinion they would disappear when the Water Authority flushed out the Pond.

Bath has hitschi and the Secretary had been in touch with the Water Authority who regretted that this was not possible during the exceptionally dry weather. The Committee decided to leave this matter for the present.

The Secretary reported that owing to lack of interest this event had had to be cancelled.

Mrs B. Harrison reported that her husband had examined the frame and considered that all that was necessary was some rubbing down & a coat of polyurethane vanish. Mrs Whennett & Mr. Hitachi offered to do this.

Numbers to be limited to 100.

Derelict Property in Village.

Mrs Hitschi reported that the Council had no authority to demolish old buildings on private land, and that it was up to Society members to approach the owners.
