Matters Arising. PLANS, The Warren, Plaisterers Lane.

Plans. Mrs. Hirsch reported that planning permission had now been granted for this site. A careful watch would be kept in the type of building to be erected there.

### Plaques


Ad Shires had nothing to report but would explore other channels and report to the next meeting.
