

Minutes of a Meeting held at Rose Cottage on
Jan 10th 1948, Mrs Hanson in the Chair.

Apologetics were received from Mrs Loveland and Mrs Morris.
The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Instead of the 1000, 250 had been purchased for £10.
This had worked out at 4/- each as the selling price
was 6/- The original estimate of 1000 for £10 had been
based on the using of offcuts but finally the best
card had been used. The embossing process was a
new one. V.A.T. had not been charged. The Committee
were grateful for the reasonable charges but felt
that in the embossing process much of the
beauty of the original had been forfeited, and
it was agreed that flat printing must be
adhered to in the future. Nevertheless it was
noted that all the cards had been sold.

Mrs Hatch reported that a gift of an ornamental
expensively chosen for Mrs Martyn's collection had

been presented at a cost of £2.99. The chairman confirmed that Mr Heath had been given a bottle of sherry.
The Bonfire Owing to inclement weather this had had to be postponed from Nov 5th - 7th. Not as many attended possibly due to the weather factor. The Springboard had suggested providing the refreshments next year if the weather should repeat itself next year.

Social Profit £11.53. Sale of tickets amounted to £105.

Raffle gross takings £12.46. Food costs £63.11.13.

Carol Evening takings £17.88. It was agreed that this be donated to the Early Birds at Portway.

Jubilee Bazaar In view of the fact that other organisations in Preston were holding sales, and that funds were now in a better shape, it was agreed not to hold one as yet.

Subscriptions £3 are in, £8 outstanding. It was thought that Mrs Morris had some in hand.

Childrens Party It was agreed that it be donated from the Society's funds.

Puddledock Lane - Plans for an Outline Plan for development of 3 dwellings were examined. Mrs Litschi explained that this was in that part of Preston zoned for development on the County Map. It was expressed that no disruption, landscape wise, would be left to mark the division of Sutton Payntz from the bulk of building in Preston. Mrs Litschi pointed out that the Planning Authority had this reverence in mind, but this development was not in the 'reverence' area. The Chairman was detailed to write the Committee's comments to the Authority.

Annual General Meeting

After some discussion it was agreed to hold it on Feb 21st prior to Mr Poole's lecture. The Chairman reported that she would be unable to serve on the Committee for the next year or so. This news was regretfully received. Mrs Litschi pointed out that a Secretary must also be found since Mrs Henson had done all the Secretarial work apart from the Minutes. Mr Gay agreed to continue as Treasurer. Mr Hanscome and Mr Litschi also wished to resign from the Committee.

It was agreed that circulars be printed inviting nominations and reminding members of the date of the A.G.M.

The date of the next meeting was fixed for Tuesday
