

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at  
on Tuesday April 11<sup>th</sup> 78 Mr Allen in the Chair.

Apologies were received from Dr Crisp, Mr Backwell & Mrs Lockard  
New Committee Members were warmly welcomed.

The Chairman asked for a volunteer to take over the  
position of Secretary, but since there were several new  
members they felt they would rather defer any offer  
until they were more conversant with the Society.

Miss Litschi consented to carry on as Minute  
Secretary for the time being.

The Main Business of the Meeting was to make final  
arrangements for the Dance on May 13<sup>th</sup>.

It was decided to serve a hot supper of fish and  
chips plus ice cream and coffee.

Mrs Borden for icecream, Mr Jay would approach  
Mrs Dodge re the coffee, Mr Smith would be responsible  
for posters and publicity, Mr Jay would arrange  
with the Springhead for the Bar, and would procure  
raffle prizes. Mr Allen would arrange with the Training  
Centre for printing of tickets and Mrs Freegarde  
would distribute them. Mr Jay and Mr Saunders would  
be on the door. It was agreed that the Dance must  
not run at a loss and after estimating the costs  
with an attendance of 70-80 in mind, the Chairman  
and Treasurer would decide ticket cost, but not to be  
more than £1.50.

at 7pm.

Village Fair - July 12<sup>th</sup> - combined with the  
Sutton Payntz Players. The Chairman of the  
Village Fair Committee (John Jay) reported that

enlarging arrangements would be given at next  
meeting.

It was decided not to hold a 'Tea on the lawn' event  
this year.

Mrs Litschi suggested a Stattle Evening or match against another Society could be arranged for later in the year.

### Tree Planting

Mr Peter Diment talked of plans to plant on Water Board land. It was agreed that he and Mrs Chapman should visit the site and then contact Mr Alan Barry (Weymouth Waterworks). In view of the interest in tree-planting it was suggested that a talk might be arranged as part of the future programme.

Coffee was served and after a vote of thanks to the Chairman for his hospitality the meeting was brought to a close.
