

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at 16
on Tuesday April 11th; Mr Allen in the Chair.

Apologies were received from Dr Crisp, Mr Backwell & Mrs Lockwood.
New Committee Members were warmly welcomed.

The Chairman asked for a volunteer to take over the
position of Secretary, but since there were several new
members they felt they would rather defer any offer
until they were more conversant with the Society;
Mrs Lettsch consented to carry on as Minute
Secretary for the time being.

The Main Business of the Meeting was to make final
arrangements for the Dance on May 13th.

It was decided to serve a hot supper of fish and
chips plus ice cream and coffee.

Mr Allen would arrange for fish & chips,
Mrs Bowden for icecream, Mr Joy would approach
Mrs Dodge re the coffee, Mr Smith would be responsible
for posters and publicity, Mr Joy would arrange
with the Springhead for the Bar, and would procure
raffle prizes. Mr Allen would arrange with the Training
Centre for printing of tickets and Mrs Freerode
would distribute them. Mr Joy and Mr Saunders would
be on the door. It was agreed that the Dance must
not run at a loss and after estimating the costs
with an attendance of 70-80 in mind, the Chairman
and Treasurer would decide ticket cost, but not to be
more than £1.50.

Future Programme

Walk to Broadmayne (Black Dog) led by Mr Saunders
should be on 30th June meeting outside Springhead
at 7pm.

Village Fair - July 12th - combined with the
Sutton Poyntz Players. The Chairman of the
Village Fair Committee (John Joy) reported that
already some 20 stalls had been arranged. Details
enlarging arrangements would be given at next
meeting.

It was decided not to hold a 'Tea on the lawn' even
this year.

Mrs Litschi suggested a Skittle Evening or Match against another Society could be arranged for later in the year.

Tree Planting

Mr Peter Diment talked of plans to plant on Water Board land. It was agreed that he and the Chairman should visit the site and then contact Mr Alan Barry (Weymouth Waterworks). In view of the interest in tree-planting it was suggested that a talk might be arranged as part of the future programme.

Coffee was served and after a vote of thanks to the Chairman for his hospitality the meeting was brought to a close.
