

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held on Tuesday,  
19<sup>th</sup> February <sup>1980</sup> at 8, Old Bincombe Lane. Mr. F. Lutsch  
in the Chair.

Minutes. The minutes of the previous meeting were  
read and adopted.

### Matters Arising.

1. Trees. A letter was received from the Chief  
Executive of the Weymouth & Portland Borough Council  
in reply to Mr. Ingham's letter. He will ask the  
Borough Engineer and Chief Planning Officer for  
their comments on the matter and will write again.

Dorset Community Council have planted 6  
trees from the pond to <sup>and along</sup> Silver St to replace  
those previously cut down.

The Water Board have planted trees along

the stream.

Mr. Cox has ten trees for the village and members are asked to find places for these to be planted. Mr. Ingham will buy some stakes for them and pay for them from petty cash.

2. Yellow lines. A letter was received from the Borough Engineer stating that the Council proposed to do nothing about reinstating yellow lines. Mr. Ingham wrote a letter asking if one or two members of the Committee would be prepared to meet him on the site so that they could be shown exactly where the difficulties arise and then the problem might be appreciated.

3. A.G.M. Mr. & Mrs. Knight and Mrs. Wollenson are willing to serve on the Committee for 1980 & Mr. Wanklin has declined from being Secretary and offered his resignation from the Committee but wishes to remain an interested, ordinary member.

5. Treasurers Report. £46.84 in the bank. Mr. Hirsch will arrange to have the accounts audited.

A.G.M. To be held on Tuesday March 11<sup>th</sup> at the Mission Hall. A film show has been arranged given by Mr. Ingram with coffee and biscuits in the interval. Mr. Hirsch and Mr. Robinson will make some posters and Owen and Mrs. ~~Loveland~~ <sup>Robinson</sup> will provide refreshments.

Any Other Business. Mr. Wanklin suggested that there is not sufficient social activity carried out in the village. Mrs. Hirsch replied that some activities hadn't been very well attended and so fewer gatherings had been organized during the last year.

Mr. Ingham suggested that perhaps the 'Players' could be included more in the Society and their programme for the year could be included in the Society's newsletter and vice versa. Also some activities might be arranged with the Osmington Society.

Mr. Ingham remarked that very little is being done about the energy crisis in the country as a whole and perhaps the Society could do something about it locally. eg. Street lights might be switched off at night. General opinion was that they use up very little energy and difficulties could arise if the matter were brought up, as some areas have very poor lighting and Sutton Poyntz is really very well supplied.

Projects on the village may be taken up by the Society, including putting up names of interesting buildings in the village.

The noticeboard and seats in the village need re-varnishing.
