

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at Terrema,  
Plover Lane, on Tuesday, 18<sup>th</sup> March <sup>1980</sup>. Mr. Laurie  
Ingham in the Chair.

1. Apologies. None.
2. Introductions. New members were introduced to other members.
3. Members of the new committee were allocated 'districts', each member to be responsible for a certain area, for collecting subscriptions and for keeping an eye on any people needing help. The Secretary would distribute jobs for collection during the next few weeks.
4. Minutes of A.G.M. and action. The minutes of the A.G.M. were read. Unless more sites were recommended during the next few days, the remaining trees from the 'Man of the Trees' would be given to Mr. Saunders for planting in the hedges. These trees were not free but very cheap. A number had been bought by private individuals in the village @ £1 per tree (and providing own stake). £8 had been paid for the trees with a return of £4.

The A.G.M. was not very well attended but perhaps it was not very well advertised.

f) Maypole. Mr. Ingham would ask Mr. Tallon if the school children could dance round the Maypole in the village next year. The school band, bellringers and Church choir might also take part if this could be arranged. The Society would organise a variety of stalls.

g) Carnival Entry. It was decided that the Society is not a large enough organisation to take part.

b) Mr. Ingham is re-doing the Carol Sheets as they are rather old and tatty.

d) A Slide Competition could be organised for the winter.

10. Newsletter. Mr. Ingham will prepare a Newsletter and suggested that another member might prepare the Autumn <sup>one</sup>.


