

The Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at 8, Ad  
Bincombe Lane on the 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 1980 Mr. Ingham in the Chair  
Apologies: Mrs. Loveland.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read  
and approved.

#### Matters Arising:

- ①. Por-holes: have been attended to in Mission  
Hall Lane. Those in Plankis Lane will be  
filled in when the new buildings are completed.
- ②. Shed erection for Indoor Madrug School:  
A new plan has been submitted for a  
smaller building. The sub-committee

agreed to this on condition that the building shells fit the proposed boundaries, and the materials are of a better quality than those proposed. The planning Committee of the Council will keep a close eye on the builders to ensure that the plans are strictly adhered to. Concern about the use of the building of later sold will be dealt with, as the Chief Planning Officer has said that Mrs Perman should make a legal agreement that the use cannot be changed without the Council's permission.

- ③ The Pond: The Depr. of Parks + Open Spaces of the Council will see about clearing the pond. Trees: It might be that the wrong trees were planted by the pond. If so, new ones will be planted, by the Council, to grow in between the existing ones.

The Queen Mother's Birthday. It was decided to send a card (last year's Christmas Card with Best Wishes) to the Queen Mother. As it would be impossible for everyone in the village to sign it in the time available, it was agreed that Harrie as Chairman should sign on behalf of the villagers.

It was suggested that a tree should be planted in the village to commemorate this event. The type and site to be decided at the next meeting.

Treasurer's Report, £127.48<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> in the current account. Mrs. Muntzer sent £1 and this will pay for her subscription for 1980+81.  
Mrs Ford of Valley Cottage: Enquiries will be made to see if she needs help in any way.

Subscriptions re. people out of village. It was decided to send such people the next newsletter and ask them if they still wish to be members of the society. If so, their membership fees will be due.

Christmas Cards Mr. Sheild has been asked to do the Society another card for Christmas 1980 but he is unable to do this owing to too few orders from other sources (He needs 12 pictures to fill one plate at the printers)

Mr Ingham will ask Mr Jepson if he would be able to make some black and white cards.

Boundaries of Sutton Poyntz. The Conservation Area of S. P. includes the Church and Asherbridge and parts of Old Preston.

As there was no other business the meeting was concluded after thanks were given to Mr + Mrs Ingham for their kind hospitality.

The next meeting will be held at 4, Sutton Court house on Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> Sept. at 7.30 pm.



At the beginning of the meeting just recorded, a representative of the Langton Herring Action Group against the nuclear power station came to speak to us. Mr. R. H. Griffiths

The main objections put forward are that Langton Herring is an area of outstanding natural beauty and it would be a disaster to have a power station in that particular situation. There would not be very much use of local skills in its construction as specialist people are recruited from throughout the country for such jobs. The dangers of leakages of radiation to the surrounding population & countryside are immense.

After hearing him speak, Mr. Ingham told the representative that he would inform him in due course of the people of Sutton Poyntz felt that they should support this Action Group. The support needed would be in giving signatures and publicising the cause through the use of stickers and posters, etc.

After Mr. Griffiths left, the meeting resumed its normal course. The members would give their views on the matter at the next meeting and the case could be put to all Sutton Poyntz members at the next A.G.M.
