

The Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at 4. Sutton Court
Lanark on Thursday 9th September 1980. Mr. L. Ingham in the Chair.
Apologies were received from Mr. McEachern, Mrs. Wilkinson and
Mrs. Robinson.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
Matters Arising.

The Pond: The Dept. of Parks & Open Spaces will find any leaks with
a dye and the holes will be stopped up: they will also
ask The Water Council about dredging the pond.

In 1974, £20 was paid by the Society towards the cost
of a water pipe, the tap to which could be turned on to
produce water in case of drought, thus preventing the pond
from drying up. The Chairman of the Society or another
knowledgeable person eg. Mr. E. Sanders would do this.

Trees: The wrong trees were planted. Pendant willows
will be planted by the Council inbetween the existing
ones. Mr. E. Sanders will restake the broken existing stakes.

Queen Mother's Birthday: It was suggested that a small
flowering tree might be planted on the 'Village Green'.
Mr. Harboun and other nearby residents will be asked
their opinion of it.

Mrs. Ford does not need help from the Society.

Langton Herring: The Committee recommended that
the publicity memo at Herby

posters in the village.

Secretary's Report. a) Membership Cards: Given will ask

Planning

Preston - Sutton Rd Traffic Control: Subject to full Council approval it has been agreed to extend the double-yellow lines from the corner of Sutton Rd down to the bus stop on the main road.

Underlea, Sutton Rd. Plans have been rejected for the second time by the Council.

Staddles: A building on the site next to Staddles will mean an extra entrance onto Plaisters' lane. Laurie will write to the Planning Committee and suggest that the new entrance is through Staddles existing entrance.

Plaisters home Traffic Very heavy vehicles are passing along Plaisters lane from nine to nine. Also traffic is travelling far too quickly along it. The Committee discussed the merits of moving the upper road signs in Plaisters lane to the very top and also moving the signs at the junction

of Plasiersha and Sutton Rd to the Ship end of Sutton Rd.

flowers together with a cake stall and raffle will be
