

The Minutes of a Committee Meeting held at Ternera, Plaisters Lane on Tuesday, 7th October 1980 Mr. L. Ingham in the Chair.

Apoligies were received from Mr & Mrs Ken Knight. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters arising: The Pond & Trees: Mr Ingham is wanting to hear from Mr. ^{Glasyer} Glasyer at the Council about work on the pond. Mr. ^{Glasyer} Glasyer will also be asked about clearing the ditches in the village.

The Queen Mother's Birthday: Mr. Harbour discussed with his neighbours the Committee's suggestion that a tree might be planted on the village green. However they did not share the Committee's enthusiasm. As no other site could be suggested, the idea was dropped.

Hangton Herring: A Newsletter has been received and will be filed.

Staddes: Jamie wrote to the Council but it was received too late, as the position of the entrance into Plaisters Lane had been passed by the Council. Plaisters Lane Traffic: Mrs. Hovland is still waiting for someone from ^{Joint} Dorset County Council to call on her.

- a) The Riding School has been approved in a modified form.
- b) Staddles : as above
- c) Cottage, Puddledock Lane. This concerns the Sunnyfields people only. The S.P. Society has no objection if Sunnyfields has no objection, providing the materials used are in keeping with the existing building. A letter to this effect was sent to the Planning Dept.
- d) Chippis Cottage : No objection to the plans, but concern expressed by Mr. M. Jacobs who represents the Sunnyfields people, about the builder's lorries driving up & down Puddledock Lane after the ^{people's} roads efforts to improve the state of Puddledock Lane. The amount of traffic is making the road worse than ever.
- e) The proposed conversion of S.P. Hall into four flats. After an open meeting held at the Mission Hall on Friday, October 3rd, a letter of rejection was sent to the Chief Planning Officer.
- f) £1 affiliation fee paid to Weymouth Civic Society.

- d) Bonfire: Several people have asked to have one in the village this year. Mr. Saunders Sons have given permission for it to be held in the waterworks field for this year, so long as people keep to the track. Villagers will be asked to help to collect rubbish for the fire. People will be asked to contribute fireworks but sparklers may be bought with Society funds.

Christmas Cards: 1000 cards have been ordered.

They will be sold for 12 pence each. Mrs. Wilkinson has kindly offered to deal with them from her house. They will be available by the 1st November.

The Next Meeting will be held at 38, Preston Rd at 7.30 pm on Tuesday, 11th November.
