

Minutes of a Committee Meeting held on Tuesday, 17<sup>th</sup>

## Matters Arising.

①. The Pond has been dredged.

The Streams have been partly cleaned by Mr Meach.

②. The Jack West Presentation was very good with a good attendance.

③. The Mill. The Chairman is still waiting for the return of the copy of the minutes taken at the open meeting and sent to Mr Meach.

④. Puddledock lane. The Chairman wrote to the Chief Executive, as noted at the last meeting, and no reply has yet been received.

Subject to the views of the Sunnyfield people, the Chairman would like to send a copy of this letter to our local Councillors asking for their opinion of what should be done next. Hopefully the Councillors might persist in backing the Sunnyfield residents in their aim to have Puddledock lane made up as a good road or at least providing a footpath.

Mr. McEachern suggested that the Society should be firstly concerned with making sure that no development ever takes place in Sutton Poyntz without the roads being made up before any building takes place. This point would be added to the letter. In the case of the Sunnyfield's people, a written declaration should have been obtained from the builder that the road would be made good within 5 years.

⑤. 83, Sutton Rd After consulting the planning sub-committee the Chairman wrote to the Dept. of the Environment stating the

views of the Society. Extra vehicular access onto the road had been applied for and the Society thought this would be dangerous because the road narrows at this point.

The owner of Linden has sent a copy of her appeal letter to the Chairman of the S.P.S. The Chairman will reply stating that the Society is sympathetic to her appeal to extend her property but is concerned about another vehicular access into Sutton Rd at this narrow part.

The owner sent a second letter to the Chairman concerning the possible widening of Sutton Rd and a footpath being laid to increase the safety of pedestrians. This has been talked about for a number of years but nothing has been done about it. The Chairman will contact Mr. Morris, the Senior Assistant Engineer of the Highways Dept. to see if there are any firm plans for this project in the near future.

⑥. Dorset Structural Plan. The Chairman attended a pictorial exhibition at Preston Village Hall. There was very little on Sutton Bourton.
