

MINUTES of Committee Meeting on Monday 25 July 1983 at
7.30 pm. at 1 Old Lincoln Lane. Mr W.H. Mercer in the

Apologies from Mr Campbell and Mrs Mullins.

1. Minutes of meeting on 6 June 1983 approved.

2. Matters arising

(a) Historical Association. This Association has expressed
gratitude for their reception on 10 June.

(b) Flooding. The Society's representatives to the
Chief Executive of the Council had been referred to the
borough Engineer who was co-ordinating comments on this
subject. The Weymouth Civic Society had written at length
to the Council on the wider subject of flooding in various

parts of the borough. Mrs. Litsch said the Council were /
(a) Hill weathering. A new one had been made at
the Derington forge and erected on the Hill, at a cost
of £50 plus. It was agreed that the Treasurer reimburse Mr. Litsch.
(b) Christmas card. The Chairman would consult again
with Mr. Rowlings. It is desirable that the cards
be available before the end of October.

3. Chairman's report - see "Planning matters".

4. Treasurer's report. Mrs. Wilkinson reported that
the only variation from the position in June was that
£74 in subscriptions had been paid into the N.S.I. Account.

5. Secretary's report. Following representations to
the Borough Surveyor, potholes in Museum Hall Lane
and elsewhere had been filled in.

6. Planning matters.

(a) Land west to "Stables", Pleiston Lane. Mrs. Litsch
said that there would be a site visit by the WBC
Planning Committee early in ^{August} July. She was a little
surprised that the Donet C.C. had raised no objection
to this proposed development from the highway point of view;
she would continue to press the Society's comments.

(b) It was reported that an application by Mr. Dodge

for construction of another dwelling by ^{"Springers"} ~~Shirley~~, Kivilio Lauu, had been rejected on grounds of access.

(c) The Springhead. Mrs. Litschii confirmed that 10-12 faava parking places then originally intended (about 60) would be provided.

(d) Conservation Policy. Mr. Sluic's paper (see minutes of Jan. 83) was discussed. Mrs. Sluic produced policy papers from Onaet CC. on Saodotoa, Briaput and several villages, and thought such a paper for the village would be desirable and useful. Mrs. Litschii undertook to check on the existence of such a paper; and two members felt that as development in the village seems virtually complete and the Society's policy is to discourage it, a "policy document" would be superfluous. The Committee agreed to pay the cost of the papers obtained by Mrs. Sluic (\$2.80), to be circulated.

7 Social Activities

(a) The coffee morning arranged for 30 July had to be postponed mainly because the date had become inconvenient to many members. It would be held on 13 August in Mr. Mercer's garden (Mission Hall, if suit).

(b) Mrs. Brown said that the art and crafts classes would resume in September/October. The history class would be re-commenced on Friday evenings later in October.

(c) It was agreed that talks by Linda Pouton (Museum

at the new Springhead (assuming the landlords agree)
