

MINUTES

of Committee meeting on Monday 9 January 1989 at "the Rest"  
Mrs Hirsch in the chair.

1. Minutes of meeting on 28.11.88 read and approved.

2. Matters arising: Commemorative stone. Mrs Hirsch said that Fredy had contacted Plymouth College who would be unable to engrave the stone for some considerable time. He was informed that a site in the farm wall, by the Springfield, would be preferable. Mr Hirsch was left to negotiate with the Sowders.

3. Chairman's report

(a) Litter: Mr Hirsch suggested we ask W.P.C. to provide litter bins near the Telephone kiosk and at the junction of Haistons Lane/Moories Hall Lane; and that members of the Committee make efforts to remove rubbish from the vicinity of their homes. Agreed.

- (b) Mr Saunders will be 90 years of age on 1 September 1989. The Committee will arrange an appropriate celebration around that time.
- (c) Rat Infestation: Mr Hyslop (W.P.C. Environmental Office) had said that the recent infestation was widespread but now appeared under control. The Chairman said she would ask Mr Hyslop to keep this under review.

#### 4. Treasurer's Report.

Mrs Wilkinson reported sales of 601 cards, plus some of previous years. Bank balance is £314.94, cash in hand £226.9 and NS account unchanged. The said Nat West bank had notified her that they proposed to make charges for operating our account, but when she told them the account would be needed for a more favourable organisation, the notification was withdrawn.

#### 5. Social Activities.

- (i) Society's 21st Anniversary: Mr Birch proposed a function at the Springhead, involving a platter meal of curry and vegetables, a marquee on part of the carpark with a jazz band and possibly other entertainment. Mr Watts <sup>would be</sup> pleased to co-operate but preferred a Friday evening. The Committee approved these ideas, with a charge of £4.50 per head, on 31 March.
- (ii) Visit to Manor Farm "The Stables": Mr Birch said Mr Cattell would be very pleased to invite the Committee and their spouses to an informal meeting to explain the facilities available. This would be on 25 January (subject to confirmation) and a few other people - e.g. President of Village W.I. and Chairman of the Church Gardening Club - would be invited.
- (iii) Summer Evening: Mr Birch was discussing with Mr Cattell the holding of an informal function during the early summer. It was agreed that this be arranged for 2nd June.

6. Annual General Meeting: The Committee decided that the AGM be held on 12 April at the Mission Hall, subject to availability. The video "Our Link to Europe" had been purchased and Mr Bradford

and agreed to loan a video recorder and T.V. Coffee and biscuits will be provided.

#### 7. A.O.B. Planning Matters

(a) Puddledock Farm Development. Mr. Biss had made available a revised plan; there would not be a separate dwelling but one of the barns would have a building adjoining it. He had written to say that he understood a site visit was a possibility; a display of photographs, plans etc would be prepared for inspection at or on the day of the visit.

Mr. P. Sacock was received, after Mr. Biss had left, to explain a difficulty which had arisen over negotiations with Mr. Diment for the sale to Mr. Sacock of an area of land adjacent to his farm dwelling. Despite promises, the vendor had done nothing until that very evening; Mr. Sacock had now been assured that a meeting on Friday next would be expected to reach agreement, and if so, he would not object to the proposals. The Committee thought no action on their part is called for.

(b) Hoppe Conservatory at Springhead. This seemed unobjectionable, subject to consideration of the actual siting.

#### 8. A.O.B.

(i) Leak of Oil into Pond. A fracture of an old oil pipe had caused a leak of oil some months ago; work had initially improved the situation but thin coverings of oil had reappeared from time. The matter will be taken up with the Water Authority and the Council.

(ii) Balls round the pond. Mr. Birch and Mr. Knight would protect the daffodils with sticks.

(iii) Visit to "Phantom of the Opera". The Secretary had written to the Theatre in London on 12 December but received no reply. On 7 January he contacted offices of Keith House and Chapman in London, with no success. The Box Office at the Theatre told him that the allocations for June-Reps 89 were all taken up;

applications for the period Oct 89-March 90 would open in March;  
Wednesday afternoon matinees were often easier than Saturdays.  
It was agreed that the position be explained to members interested  
with a view to a visit next winter.
