

### MINUTES

of Committee meeting on Tuesday 7th February 1989 at 1 Old Biscuite Lane.  
Mr Matt Roschilly, Vice-Chairman, in the chair. Apologies from Mrs Joyce  
Kibochi and Mrs Gwen Lowland

1. Minutes of meeting on 9 January 1989 read and signed as correct.

### 2. Matters arising

(i) Commemorative plaque: Mr Saunders thought that the plaque might  
be affixed to the canal bridge. It was decided that when the plaque  
is available, members would discuss its siting.

(ii) Rats: Mrs Kibochi had spoken to the Environmental Health Dept.  
who are monitoring the position.

(iii) Litter: The Borough Engineer had written saying he thought more  
litter bins might cause more problems and that present sweeping  
and collecting arrangements are adequate. It was decided to make  
renewed representations for a bin by the telephone kiosk/seat.

(iii) Oil in Road: The Engineer's Dept had undertaken to  
keep the situation under review. There had been little, if any,  
evidence of seepage for some time.

(iv) A.G.M. All members present were willing to be re-elected

to the committee, and Mrs Ursula Drake will be approached. Everyone coincident that Mrs Kirkley should continue as chairman.

3. Chairman's report. Mr Dochilly reported, on behalf of the Chairman, on the situation regarding the District planning application, so far as the Council are concerned.

4. Treasurer's report. The balances are: Bank £328.44, petty cash £23.69, and N.S. Account £1285.67.

5. Secretary's report. Mr Knight reported on a meeting with Mr Alan Butler, local artist, who would be interested in producing packs of black & white drawings of aspects of the village. The cost would be around £160 ~~£100~~ plus VAT for 500 packs <sup>of three different cards</sup> (a sample pack Mr Butler had done of the Lytch area was available). It was decided to look further into the purchase of 500 packs, and six possible views were suggested as an alternative.

#### 6. Planning matters

(a) Carriewatery at Springhead. The Planning Dept of W.D.B.C. had been informed of our wish to see that this building did not too greatly affect parking arrangements.

(b) District development. Mr Birch said that the Weymouth Civic Society was very concerned about this development and its likely effect on the use of the "green wedge"; W.C.S. thought that our Society could have been firmer in rejecting the proposals. Mr Birch had explained our views.

#### 7. Social Activities

(a) Visit to the Stables Jack Club. Members of the Committee and representatives of other local bodies had been entertained at the club on 25 January, when Mr Battell explained his plans for development of the back land (swimming pool, sports centre, and golf course were possibilities, subject to planning consent, etc..)

(b) 21st Anniversary. Don Birch has engaged a jazz band for about £60, arranged for a marquee to be erected in the pub grounds, and discussed food with Mike Watts. It was unlikely that a sweet could be provided. A group of amateur entertainers might also be engaged. The cost per head would not be more than £4.50 and might be a little less. Tickets will be available in advance.

(c) "Summer Evening": Arrangements for 2 June are being discussed; a young people's group might be engaged.

W.C.S. Events: Don Birch will exhibit information in our notice box, when received from the Civic Society.

Mandarin Ducks: An Litschii will be asked about the present position.
