

MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING  
on Tuesday 25 April 1989 at 7.0 pm. in the Mission Hall.  
Mrs Hibsch in the chair. Apologies from Mrs Rowbotham.

1. Selection of Officers. The following were elected:

2. Minutes of meeting on 13 March 1989 read and signed as correct.
3. Matters arising:
  - (a) Bowlage fencing. Mrs. Hibsch had spoken to Councillor Hanvey and the W.P.C. Planning Office, and the matter will be referred to the Bexley Council Footpaths Officer for investigation.
  - (b) The Pond - reinstatement seems satisfactorily completed.

(c) The Mill House. The County and Borough authorities are discussing how far intervention is possible.

(d) Sea Harbour's display. Sea Harbour recognises that this display is now in a tatty state and she hoped her son-in-law would be restoring it.

4. Chairman's report. Mrs Libbli said the commemorative stone was now being cut to provide about 4" thickness. A formal request has been sent to Mr Stock that permission be given for its setting in the car park wall. It was generally agreed that the damaging of the stone was reprehensible.

5. Secretary's report (a) A letter from Mr Michael Freshly was read: it regretted the anxiety caused to the Chairman at the AGM over the Stone and expressed views on the Committee being fully informed before decisions are taken. The Chairman reiterated that the Stone was obtained with the assistance of the Mayor, and Mrs Freshly was sorry that the incidents had been caused through the stone not being in the agreed site.

(b) Environmental/Litter book. The W.C.S. asked whether ~~the~~ Society would agree to a portable exhibition - installed and dismantled by W.C.S. - being arranged in the village. This was approved.

(c) Mr A. Buller's pack of <sup>noted</sup> ~~notes~~ had just been delivered - 480 packs at a cost of £147. It was agreed that they be sold at 75p each.

6. Treasurer's Report There is £316.82 in the bank account, plus cash £7.24, and N.S. account £1285.67.

7. Social Activities. Mr Birch reported on up-to-date arrangements. The maximum number of guests should be about 100, and the new Manager had agreed to proceed with all the arrangements previously agreed.

Had the function been at the Springhead, Mr P. Stock of Slaneishi's would have loaned one of the company's marquees; but because no decent one was available he had paid £40 deposit on the hire of another, which he said he would not ask the Society to reimburse. In view of our changing the venue, however, it was unanimously agreed that Mr Stock be paid the £40.

10. A.O.B.

Reference was made to the suggestion at the AGM that new members be invited free to their first event. The Committee considered this impracticable, since the first event could be costly; but they hoped members would make early contact with newcomers to encourage membership of the Society.

Planning - Development at the Stables

Mr P. Dance, a town planner of Residential Property Services, attended the meeting between 7.30 and 8.45 pm, with eleven members from around the Stables site, to discuss proposals to rehabilitate the barn and construct another two dwellings. Plans were on display. He referred to discussions with the W.P.C. Planning Dept., as a

recall of which preliminary plans had been revised. He was aware of the need for the development to fit in with the environs and emphasised that high standards would be maintained. Various questions as to likely further development were asked and replied to; Mr Dance thought that more than four houses would be impracticable in any case. He thought that the previous DOE decisions on appeals affecting the site and the fact that Miss Vitruvius' bungalow had been "knocked" to the stables had at some time to be considered. Discussion also ensued on the realignment of the development boundary and how far it is feasible or correct to deal with this application before the structure plan has been formally amended - this is understood to be awaiting the Latton Inquiry. Mr Biss thought an "architectural impact" was essential & Mr Dance said he would be willing to discuss this although time was most material; he would also consider levels and the reconsider the height of the dwelling which would be within 10 feet of Mr Biss's house.

After Mr Dance had left the meeting, further discussion ensued. It was finally agreed -

- (a) the loss of the stables is regrettable but probably inevitable.
- (b) the design of the dwellings calls for reconsideration, & steps be taken with a view to an architect advising us;
- (c) the street scene, levels, and effect of any visibility splays <sup>and</sup> are important, and the Council should supply details;
- (d) we reiterate the situation emphasised by the DOE appeals only 18 months ago and question why plots covered by a revised, but unapproved, boundary are being accepted.
- (e) the matter be discussed, in the light of developments, before the meeting fixed for 22 May.

Representations will be made urgently to the Planning Department.
