

MINUTES of Committee Meeting on Tuesday 27 February 1990 at Hutton Lodge,
Bulldog Lane. Mrs J. Titeler in the chair.

1. Minutes of meeting on 23.2.90 were read and signed as correct,
subject to a slight amendment regarding the amount (Minute 7).

2. Matters arising:

(i) 1st Hardy 1990. Mr. Hicks referred to the "Evening" on 14 July. The usual caller would be on holiday; a five-piece band could be booked at a cost of £110. Refreshments and a raffle could be arranged; the cost might be of the order of £3 per head. The Weston Village Hall has been booked but confirmation was awaited.

The Committee agreed these arrangements.

(ii) It was agreed that the usual Summer Walk be held on 22 June
and in the form of a circular walk from the bridge at Lower
Bockhampton (a favourite of Hardy's), with cars to take people from
the Springhead and back.

(iii) Tea on the Lawn would be on 18th August at Hutton Lodge
(or Clyffe, Plaister Lane).

(iv) The Organiser of Hardy 1990 had arranged for someone else to
take on the selling of tickets for the balloon ascent, but would
welcome any assistance for the events on 2 and 3 June at
Dorchester & Kingston Marnwood respectively. Several members indicated
their willingness to help.

(v) Litter and bins. Mrs Titeler had spoken to three officers of W.P.C.,
all of whom were "looking into the matter raised" - so far with no
positive outcome. She would pursue them.

(vi) A.G.M. 4th April. The presenter of the slide show on Kingfishers
had indicated that his fee is £10, plus cost of travel. As this
was considered inappropriate, arrangements had been made for
the Alan Stevens of Cuckney to give a presentation on birds, animals, etc.
of the Falklands, for a fee of £16. This was accepted with pleasure.

3. Secretary's Report. Mr Knight said that a new letter would be

available in good time before the A.G.M.

4. Treasurer's Report. There was no change in the figures reported to the last meeting.

5. Social Events. Unfortunately the talk by Mr Shepherd had to be cancelled at short notice due to his admission to hospital. He will be contacted, when recovered, about a presentation next winter.
(Other social matters - Minute no. 2).

6. Planning Matters.

- (a) The Diment's plans. Mr Biss said that the plans for the farmhouse had been accepted by D.O.E. as originally submitted. In reply to questions, he said he thought that, as regards most of the land, no alternative use to farming seemed likely. Ownership was, however, in several hands. Mr Diment's proposals as regards the Cuckoo Valley site were understood to have been agreed by West Dorset D.C.
- (b) The Riding Stables. Mr Biss said he understood the site has now been sold; a fresh planning application might be pending. The Committee agreed that this must be carefully monitored.

7. Other Matters.

- (a) Dorset Best Kept Village Competition. This, was referred to the Society by the Village W.I. The aims of the competition (basically how the community works to care for the environment etc, rather than best kept gardens and the like) were discussed, and the Committee agreed that the Society should enter. Everyone will be encouraged to assist in all ways possible.
- (b) Illuminated Advertising Units on the Esplanade. Planning applications (by the Council) for 11 such units were discussed. Strong representations against them will be made, bearing in mind ^{tourist} amenity and attraction considerations.
- (c) Next year's Committee. Mrs Stephen wished not to seek re-election, because of many other commitments, but would continue to assist

at social functions, etc. She was thanked for all she has done for several years. Other members present expressed willingness to serve again (Mr. Saunders, Mr. Embden + Mrs. Swords were not present).
