

MINUTES of Committee Meeting on Tuesday 24th April 1990

Apologies from Mr Knight 11 members present

1. Minutes of meeting held on 27th February 1990

2. Matters arising:

Mr. Birch gave a list of helpers required.

After some discussion a vote was taken "That nothing would be given to charity from this event. The Committee would consider it at the end of the year if funds allowed". Motion was carried.

Parts for two plays was discussed by Mr Emblem. 4 for Nettie. 6 for Andy.

It was decided to start the evening at 7.30 and Dorset Country music would be played on arrival i.e. The Jethers: Dorset is beautiful.

Tea On Lawn

Mr Bugler reported that his wife would like only two people in her kitchen as it was small. Mrs Bugler suggested the scones be served as they are, along with little pots of jam and cream. Committee asked to have little pots.

8. Best Kept Village Competition

Mrs Kitchi read letter to Committee which was to be circulated to every household. It was decided we should work together with W.I. rather than in separate projects. Brownies and Cubs to be given specific projects.

Did Mr Biss speak to Mr. Arment about verges in Puddledock Lane? The answer was in the affirmative but there had been no response from Mr. Arment. Mr Bugler asked where we could get sacks for rubbish collected. Mrs. Kitchi will approach Council for free bags.

Mr Bugler said Stream near Bellamy Cottage needs clearing. Mrs Kitchi said it would be cleared as usual by Council but we could watch the situation. It was decided to start regular working parties on Saturday mornings from early May.

9. Dorset Structure Plan

Mr Emberton said he had studied the Plan and said it did not give us much information. Mr. Biss thought it was not important to the Society. It was decided no comment was

necessary. In any case relevant meetings have already taken place.
