

MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING ON 21 MAY 1990 AT  
LITTLE ACRES, HUDDLESTON LANE. Mrs J. Litschi in the chair  
9 members present. Apologies from Mr Riss, Mr Hawkins & Mrs Harrold-Kenn.

1. Minutes of meeting on 24 April 1990 read and signed as correct.

2. Matters arising:

- (a) Rest Dept Village beautification. The Borough ~~Engineering~~ representative, Mr Ted Wilbourn, has arranged for the pond and streams to be cleared, some hedges trimmed and a few shrubs to be provided. A letter of appreciation will be sent to the Engineer. He will be asked to give attention to the drains at the junction of Miller Road & Ruskin Hall Lane.

Tony Hughes had organised several working parties who have been clearing verges, the small car park etc.; and the local brownies have done some litter clearing. The W.I. are also to be involved in keeping areas under inspection. Transport services and the new owner of the Car Park have helped with disposal of rubbish, grass etc. The Committee expressed thanks for all these services. The W.I. are considering providing a small tree to be planted at the fork junction; the Committee accepted his suggestion, subject to the approval of the local authority.

- (b) The Station Road Development. Mrs Litschi had not yet written in view of reported fresh developments, but the Committee considered that our representations to W.D.C. would do no harm at all.

3. treasurer's report.

Cash in hand is £24.69; at bank £299.20. No change in N.S. account. Mrs Wilbourn said she feared that the bank might never then request for charges to manage our account. She was asked to make enquiries of other banks or building societies with whom the Society could more beneficially open an account.

#### 4. Social Activities

- (a) Summer Walk. Arrangements proceeding satisfactorily. Mr Tarrant had offered the use of a mini-bus, and a notice about details will be placed in the notice-frame.
- (b) The Hardy Evening. The bubbles said most parts for the play are settled and the remainder will be shortly: only a few rehearsals are needed. Mr Birch had made arrangements with Peckham Village Hall about the provision of curtains etc in the stage, following another organisation's use of it on 30 June. It was agreed that Mr Birch & Mr Bubble settle the printing of tickets, which might also be a commercialise programme.
- (c) Teas on the Lawn - further consideration later on.

This briefly mentioned possible demand for another visit to a London Theatre, possibly to see "Miss Saigon". The pub theatre group are understood to be arranging such a visit; liaison will be made with them. It was agreed that we should not undertake any visits to a theatre outside London, and then only infrequently.

5. Planning Matters. The Committee decided to offer no comments on proposals for dormer windows at 62 Sutton Road, first-floor extension at "Meadow View", Raistors Lane, and replacement garage and new pods at "Mortlands", Raistors Lane. Nothing to report re the Stables.

#### 6. A.O.B.

A few problems over households, <sup>not</sup> being on collectors' "patches" were sorted out.

8. Thanks expressed to Mr Birch for hospitality, especially as Mrs Williamson had not been able to entertain us and Mr Birch had unfortunately fallen earlier in the day. The Committee conveyed best wishes to her.
