

MINUTES

3. Committee meeting on 8 September 1992 at 7.30 pm at the Old Stables, Sutton Road. Mr Tony Buzler, in the chair; all members present except the Treasurer (apologised).

1. The minutes of the meeting on 28 July 1992 were read, approved + signed.
2. Mr G. Parks. The Chairman received a letter from Gordon Parks reporting his inability to undertake the job he would like, because of family and business difficulties; he said that "if it was felt that he should be replaced, he would fully understand." This was regarded as a resignation and accepted.
3. Matters arising from Minutes.
 - (a) Buntington by-pass. Liaison with Cllr Derek Dodge is maintained.
 - (b) Proposed play-area. The Chairman had spoken to Mr Parkhouse (elder of the Chapel and owner of land adjacent), Miss Saunders and representatives of Essex Water, about possible sites, although each presented a problem. The Chairman is pursuing the matter.
 - (c) Ospringham footpath. The Chairman + Vice Chairman, having walked the path, considered it unsatisfactory but there is a difficult gate to negotiate. Representations will be made to Dorset CC.
 - (d) Ducks on the pond. The Chairman has spoken to Elizabeth Saunders, Jim White of the pub, Dave Baddy and Phil Suck. It is more likely that (a) the Saunders will let us have the ducks' old shed, which needs some repair, (b) the field by the pub or a piece of just land could be used for the shed (although in the case of the field, the new owners ~~would~~ have to approve), and (c) Dave Baddy could devote 80% of his time to care for the ducks when he retires, provided there is a role to cover the balance.

It was agreed (i) that the Society will contribute a reasonable sum towards the upkeep of the ducks and (ii) the matter of buying the ducks to be considered again in the Spring.

Simon Bullock mentioned a raffle type competition at the Springfield

which has already raised £32 towards the upkeep of the ducks.

(d) Middle dock Lane name-plates. A letter has been sent to the Borough Engineer (8.8.92) and a reply awaited.

4. Chairman's Report. Tony Bugler referred to the sale of North Down farm equipment and animals that day. An old wagon with "E.A. Saunders, Setton Peatyz" painted on it had been bought by this White of the Springhead for £110, plus VAT. It will be displayed outside the pub after refurbishment. The Committee decided to make a contribution of £55 towards the cost, on the understanding that the wagon is not removed from the village.

5. Secretary's Report. Another newsletter is due. The Chairman agreed to write an introduction about the number of significant changes in the village during recent weeks.

6. Financial Report. Mrs Wilkinson's statement was read.

Bank balance - £367.58; petty cash in hand £18.12; N.S. A/C £2,000.70.

There are 280 packets of the notebooks and 461 greetings cards in hand, so the Committee did not think another Christmas card is necessary, as Eve enquired; in any event, it is too late in the year to be considering such a card, even if production is feasible.

7. Planning Matters.

(a) W.P.C. Planning pre-deposit Consultation Paper. This was supposed to have been delivered to all houses in the borough but it appears that Maister Lane has been omitted; the secretary will endeavour to get copies for all committee members. The document seeks views on various aspects (environment, economy, housing, transport, tourism, minerals etc) to be dealt with for the period to 2001. A sub-committee of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman & Secretary will meet on 21.9.92, with any other member free to attend or submit comments to the Chairman.

(b) Puddledock farm-house appeal. Further consideration was given to this matter. The beans have recently been gathered but the flax remains apparently unharvested - but perhaps weather conditions are relevant. It has been suggested by one or two people that Mr Seal has tried to persuade the farmer from Blidstock who is using the land that he should occupy the farmhouse, as Mr Seal does not wish to.

It was decided to inform the D.O.E. that the Society stands by its previous views, as expressed to W.P.B.C. on 31.8.91 and that even if some crops are grown on part of the land that is insufficient justification for a new farmhouse.

(c) Waterside Caravan Park. The Chairman and others met W.P.B.C. Cliff Planning Officer on the site. A mound of earth going up the hill is to be removed, and planning consent will be needed for other earthworks. Eight "Temporary" caravans are being investigated and 34 caravans in the S.E. of the area are to be removed by the end of October.

It was agreed that, if action as envisaged is not taken, the matter will be publicised in the local press, especially in view of the Dorset C.G. paper "Caring for Dorset" and the CPRE's stance on the control of caravans in this area. It was also decided to enquire of W.P.B.C. whether (and if so, when) their previously undisturbed policy of prohibiting touring caravans in this part of the borough was abandoned; if so, why?

(d) St. Andrews School-house + buildings. The Trustees have applied for consent to convert an existing building into a private dwelling, with a double garage, and to construct five houses with garages on part of the open space where the "Temporary" classrooms are. The Committee recognised why these developments are proposed; the Council will be informed of the need for "sympathetic" construction.

V. Social Activities.

(i) Cream Teas. Unfortunately atrocious weather caused the cancellation. In view of sales of supplies and a few people having

teas, however, the afternoon produced a profit of 39 p.

(8) Future events.

- (i) Talk on helicopters- no further action.
- (ii) Funfair at Netherne - in the absence of Gordon Peeks from the committee, no further action to be taken.
- (iii) Visit to Dorking Museum - Secretary to endeavour to arrange.
- (iv) Barn Dance, March 1993. It was agreed that the 25th anniversary function should be another barn dance. Ron Birch repeated his inability to organise it - for reasons we all understand, but he would assist as much as possible. It was agreed that a committee of Liz Howarth, Richard Backwell and Charles Kirk (who is willing to serve and will be formally invited by the Chairman) deals with the arrangements. Ron Birch undertaken to book the hall and band.
- (v) ? Christmas gathering. The Chairman wondered whether a function for villagers, with children performing something, might be arranged. It was pointed out, however, that "Preston Panto Kids" undertake do's at Christmas. The idea was not pursued.

9. Other business.

Speeding in Plaisterers Lane, Sutton Road appears to be increasing, some of it bordering on dangerous. Some parking at the fork junction was said to make matters worse occasionally. Questions of methods of restraining speed were discussed briefly; this will be reconsidered at the next meeting.

10. Next Meeting - 20th October at the Mill.
