

## MINUTES

A Committee Meeting on 7th July 1993 at 7.30 pm at 5 Old Buncome Lane. Mr Bagley, in the chair; apologies from A. Backwell and C. Brown.

1. Minutes of meeting on 14 June read, confirmed and signed.

2. Matters arising:

- (1) Britain in Bloom: The following main activities were reported:
  - (a) Mr D. Heaton and Mr P. Stanley of W.P.C. had toured the village with the Chairman, Secretary + Ron Birch and agreed a number of things the Council would attempt to achieve 20 July;
  - (b) Mrs Harding, the judge, and her husband would be entertained to coffee at 10.30 and lunch after the judging, at the Springhead (with the Chairman + Vice-Chairman - other Committee members paying for their own lunch);
  - (c) Ron Birch had arranged with Mr David Sales to hire 12 pots of flowers and four hanging baskets; the Committee left it to the Chairman and Ron to distribute them in the village;
  - (d) the route to be taken by the judge (with the Chairman + others) had been determined after a tour of the village. [Very briefly - Springhead, Bellamy Lane, <sup>old</sup> Police House, Brookmead, Puddledock Lane to Sutton House, Old Buncome Lane; then car at Sutton Close to "Wayfolds", walk back to Silver Street and up to little car park, view of Mission Hall Lane and waterworks, then back to pub].
  - (e) The group in which the village enters includes Bartcott + Heriton St. George (Somerset); Denbury, E. Budleigh, Pathwater Village near Exeter, Sampford Courtney and Weare Gifford (Devon), Kenn (Avon) and Pentewan (Cornwall).
  - (f) The new owners of 2 Old Lane are very helpful; thought will be given to planting a tree or shrubs near their house.
- (ii) Mr Harrison's Exhibits: Jim Willis has donated wood for a new case, which John Harrison has agreed to make.

### 3. Chairman's Report.

- (i) Tony Bagler referred to a meeting with Mr Stables (Wessex Water Project Manager) on 24 June. The company are anxious to assist in community projects and will almost certainly provide a seat on the knoll up from "Wyndings footpath"; consideration will also be given to planting a few trees, but this may not be so desirable. They will also, without commitment, consider allowing the Society a room in the local Museum for exhibits relating to this area, and also acquiring a light marquee for hiring out to local organisations.
- (ii) Mr Bagler also mentioned correspondence from Mr Bond about maps being posted up concerning the use of footpaths, including the "permissive use" of the new access way and adjacent footpaths; and the provision of two passing-gates on two footpaths (which make use by pedestrians convenient but prevent stock from straying).

### 4. Secretary's Report.

A newsletter will be ready for distribution in a week or so.

### 5. Treasurer's Report.

Mr Gumbley said there was no change in the position reported last month. On the question of subscriptions, it appeared that about £60 have still to be collected, and lists for the membership secretary are required. Mr Meach said that Mr Sheppard of Leylands Way, who joined two years ago, was upset to be informed at a S.P.S. meeting he attended that he should not have done so as he lived outside the village. The Secretary will write to apologise for this completely unauthorised and incorrect comment, and invite Mr Sheppard to re-join.

### 6. Planning matters - nothing to report, apart from a comment at a W.C.S. meeting that Mr Seal (Buddlelock Farm area) had declined to give an undertaking not to seek to use some of his land for housing.

### 7. Social Activities

- (a) Whitcombe Stables. We have been asked to offer a visit for up

to a year as a new manager was being appointed and there are some problems.

(b) Green Fair. 31.7.93. Don Buch detailed a list of helpers, providers of chairs etc., purchases of food + cream, and arrangements for notices and advertising. He suggested a charge of £1.20 but the Committee decided to retain the £1. It was agreed that no raffle be held. As regards entertainment, it was thought that the young violinist would not be heard too well in the Critchell's garden; the John Young will be asked if he can entertain on his portable organ.

8. Grateful thanks, to Mrs Webbett for hospitality at two consecutive meetings.
