

MINUTES

of Committee Meeting on 6 July 1994 at 7.30 pm at 5 Old Huccombe Lane.
Tony Butler in the chair, apologies from C. Brown and R. Meech.

1. Minutes of meeting on 24.5.94 read, confirmed and signed.

2. Matters arising

(a) Village name-plate. The owners of the Mill will make a decision as to setting when they have seen the name-plate.

(b) Village Scare. This was highly successful, raising about £4,000. The tombola made £600 all but a few pence; thanks were expressed to all who had run it, including Pat Butler who decorated it. A letter of thanks will be sent to those who gave major prizes - Colridge Rose, beers; Springhead, case of wine; Mrs & Mrs Daires, cosmetics; Elizabeth Saunders, brandy.

A letter is expected from the Organising Committee for inclusion in the next newsletter.

(c) New Monument Rules - advice expected from County Council.

(d) The seat - Richard Meech said it was being installed in a day or two, with a plaque indicating presentation by Trevor Water.

It was reported that Mr. Howell was asked for his plaque to refer to "residents of Sutton Hayes" and not his late wife by name.

(f) Christmas Card - Simon Gudgin said that Mr. Anders would make available a photograph n too, but at a charge. This to be considered further.

3. Secretary's Report - Ken Knight

- (a) A letter of sympathy was sent to Mr Howell on the death of his wife.
- (b) An order has been made by W.P.B.C. relating to the undertakers doorknobs.

4. Treasurer's Report - Simon Gudgin.

Income since last meeting - £163.15; expenditure £22.03.
Cash at bank £5.56, petty cash £50.60.

Most cabs have been collected. The Jays Committee have repaid the £200 loaned in November; this was accepted (interest forgone).

5. Planning Matters.

- (i) Footpaths. The Secretary had asked the Chief Planning Officer about the new signs discussed last autumn. Mr. Burgess said note that expected funds from the TDAP were not available now and discussions were taking place with the County Planning Dept. about alternative funding. (It was reported that the Board, the farmer, was not willing to make more than a nominal contribution).
- (ii) Footpath off Puddledock Lane - the Chairman reported that this matter has been referred to the council's Footpath Office.

On the recent walk^{to Dunsley}, a very difficult two-bar barrier was experienced; the Chairman had referred this to West Dorset District Council who were looking into it.

- (iii) Caravans at Humphrey's Garden Centre. It was decided to ask the Chief Planning Officer for his comments on the display of caravans at this site, to reinforce Miss Bruce's representations.
- (iv) No observations had been offered on plans for small developments at Harwin, Mission Hall Lane and in Silver Street.
- (v) Caravan next to "bunuelot". The caravan had been removed.

but an old B.R. transport vehicle had been put in its place and used to convert it into a 'mobile home', involving heavy barking and activities throughout the day, was annoying to neighbours. Peter Lister said that the scores of the bengalees expected the work to be completed in a week or two. After considerable discussion it was decided to seek the comments of the Chief Planning Officer as to the legality of this activity.

(vi) Boulders at Waterside Camp. The Chairman had been informed that W.H.C. expected the boulders to be moved in due course. He would be keeping an eye on the position.

6. Social Activities

- (a) The Colist Drive. Only 8 people attended - Mr. Sandall's party had not been informed of it. Stock of prizes meant that about £5 was made. It was decided to arrange another during the winter.
- (b) The Walk. Again very small attendance - nine people but enjoyable.
- (c) Cream Tea at "Wyndlings". A meeting to settle details to be held at "Wyndlings" on 8 August. It was agreed that Ron Birch should again get the scores made.
- (d) Future activities - consideration to be given to colist drive; a talk by Ron Birch/Alan Birch on their cruise; coffee and mince pies or cheese and wine party near Christmas. Next year's walk might incorporate a treasure hunt.

7. Britain-in-Bloom.

Mrs Harding will judge on 15 July. Ken Knight offered to provide coffee for all at 10 am. Ron Birch will arrange lunch at the Springfield (the Society to pay only for Mrs. & Mr. Harding).

A rota of members to clear up various parts of the village was allotted, commencing on Friday 8 July.

The bengalees would be reminded of grass-cutting etc beforehand and also asked whether the pond could be cleared of weed etc.

8. Other Business /over

8. (a) Mr Ryan had mentioned the need for a mirror opposite ^{traffic} Biddleford Lane, in Saltash road. He will be asked to obtain quotations etc. Members felt that residents of the lane might be willing to subscribe towards the cost.
- (b) CPRE/English Heritage. These two bodies have links and are keen on pond preservation. The Chairman has brought the pond in the late H Dineen's field to their notice.
- (c) The stream from the pond. Mr Brown will be asked to look into the absence of water from the Eastern side of the stream from the Mill to the fork junction. Simon Cawley said he would also speak to the new owners (David & Maureen Morris).
