

MINUTES

of Committee Meeting on 27 February 1995 at Little Acorns,  
Puddledock Lane ("byelaws" not available) at 7.30 pm. Tony Brugler  
in the chair. Apologies from R. Backwell, A. Smeller & Mrs D. Rebbutt.

1. Minutes of meeting on 16.1.95 (written by Mrs J. Hinchliffe) were read, approved and signed.

2. Matters arising

(a) The Magne. Chairman <sup>was</sup> asked to try to expedite its installation on the rebuilt building on Northdown Farm.

(b) Post Cards. Now being sold. £21 paid in recently by Eve Hodder-Wilkinson for sales of various cards.

(c) Britain in Bloom. The application form for our 1995 entry has been submitted. The Chairman referred to the unsatisfactory arrangements

for the Children's painting competition by the B-i-B organisation last year.

On his suggestion, it was agreed that we should promote our own children's competition, with small prizes, and various people could be asked to judge.

(d) Information Panels - it is accepted that lack of sponsorship and money may be delaying action on this matter.

& the Village W.I. to be formally invited to participate this year, possibly by looking after the Sutton Room.

#### 3. Chairman's Report.

The Chairman mentioned grants likely to be available from the Millennium Fund and the National Lottery <sup>Charity</sup> Fund to charities and other undertaking work for local benefit (e.g. here, refurbishing or even acquiring the Sutton Room). The Secretary undertook to find out about these grants.

#### 4. Secretary's Report

A.G.M. - details were discussed, including posters to be ~~not~~ prepared by Richard Weeks. Nomination papers to be available for membership of the Committee. Possible nominees for the Committee were mentioned, the Chairman and Secretary asked to approach them. (Dave Caddy, Margaret Sykes, Peter Jones, Team Kirk) beach Clean - on 23.4.95. #### 5. Manning.

(a) Local Plan Inquiry. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Mr Tyson, Mr Farrant and Mr Bruce had attended one or both days (15 + 16/2/95). There was general recognition of the competence of the Council's Q.C. and its case. The findings may be known in the ~~late~~ summer, or not until year-end if the report encompasses the inquiry into the relief road alternatives.

(b) Devon Structure Plan. Our representations were acknowledged by Devon CC who undertook to consider them.

(c) High-speed "Yester event" - The helpful reply from the Minister of Railways and Roads (Dr Ian Bruce, M.P.) was read and noted.

(d) Planning Application OO35P - Land near "the cottage, Puddledock Lane The Chairman reported on comments made on this outline application for a bungalow "in effect in of the barn conversion - broadly, not objecting in view of the agent's undertakings

#### 6. Social Activities

- (c) Teas on the Lawn. See Lebbett informed the Chairman of discussion in Old Bingley Lane. He suggested 29/7/95 as the date and £1.20 the charge. It was agreed that arrangements be left to the appropriate residents of O.B.L., but that the world offer all assistance requested.
- (d) Midsummer Walk. Details to be settled with Richard Hatchell.
- (e) Future arrangements. Provisionally agreed -
- (i) Talk on India by Miller + Sarah Smith in October } Chairman
  - (ii) Talk on Old Sutton Peasant by Honnie Waite in November. } to pursue.
  - (iii) Christmas Coffee + Mince Pies.

#### 7. A.O.B.

- (i) Water in Sutton Road - Mrs Litchie undertook to take up with the Borough Engineer problem of spring water in her area of the road, which could be very dangerous in frosty weather.
- (ii) Tree at Huddledock Lane/Sutton Rd junction. A large section of the tree which snapped off in gales recently had been cleared by the Huddly. Although the remaining main branch appears dangerous, it was decided to defer action as S.E.B. may be doing so.
- (iii) Hinman Hospice. Revd Adele John Broyle had asked the Society to bear in mind the Hospice's special need for assistance this year. The Committee felt that the Society would not be assisting any charities for some time.
- (iv) Dumping of rubbish. Ken Gidch will take up with the council instances of considerable amounts of building rubbish being deposited in Huddledock Lane and elsewhere.

5 (e) Planning. Weymouth Bay and Seaview Holiday Parks. In the current list are applications by Haven Leisure to obtain the existing caravan & tented camping sites, in each case for use also by "mixed touring units" - caravans, tents & motor-homes. It was decided to express considerable regret that these applications should be made; they are contrary to the spirit of both local and county plans concerning caravanning and the need for restrictions. Although the area of land to be used may not be increased, the visual impact will be seriously adverse.
