

MINUTES

of Committee Meeting on 30 May 1998 at Weyndean, Blairstown Lane.
Terry Butler in the chair; all present except R. Birch who apologised.

1. Minutes of meeting on 19.4.98 read, approved and signed.

2. Matters arising:

(a) Traffic calming. -

Representations to the Council brought a reply from S. Morris,

Highways Agency Manager, commenting that smaller roads can be said to be on the priority list, with no significant accident problems. Financial constraints also affected the matter.

It was decided that theorough Councillor be asked to receive members to press the case for something to be done to cause traffic to slow down.

(b) Footpath, Sutter Rd. - Although "this scheme (NP94) has been on the cards for many years" again finance for such schemes has been even further reduced and no estimate of introduction of a scheme for Sutter Road can be given. This was accepted with regret.

(c) Millennium Fund. Reply from Wessex Water still awaited.

Newsletter (explaining need for large and important schemes to qualify for assistance) just received.

(d) The Broom Route. Correspondence with County Council and Ian Bruce MP was read. In a letter to Mr Bruce, the Minister for Local Transport on (14.2.95) explained the c.p.o. procedure and possible public inquiry; the Department had not at that time accepted the Relief Road proposals and there is "very stiff competition for limited resources available" even if a further bid were made by Dorset CC.

(e) St Andrews Bleach. Car parking etc. The Chairman referred to the discussion on 11 May (see note of meeting) and the Secretary read correspondence with the Chief Planning Officer about the possibility of making use of the derelictated Mann Farm building (Bleach Rd.). The C.P.O. "will not let matters rest" and may well initiate action at the end of the summer.

3. Britain-in-Bloar

(a) Trimmers are installed on the Sutter Road, which the W.I. will ~~maintain~~ maintain.

(b) The position regarding the mass of tree branches etc by Puddledock bridge was explained on behalf of Ron Bush. Mr Diment was agreeable to the area being reasonably cleared provided no further cost falls on him. Simon Bebbell has arranged for the wood to be taken away; and a working party to cut it up, etc., was

arranged.

- (c) The Chairman will renovate the frame by his Harbour and Mr Noden Williams will be approached about renovation of the S.P.S. notice box.
- (d) The Children's competition has been agreed with Maureen Bond, and George Shines has agreed to judge entries. Notices will be exhibited.
- (e) Simon Bullock will liaise with the Offshore Engineer about road-sweeping, etc. some time before the date of judging.
- (f) The Chairman explained only snow is available this year to undertake the ideas mentioned at the A.G.M. A letter to all villagers will be prepared for distribution shortly.

4. Chairman's Report

- (i) A letter of condolence was sent to the widow of Stan Gates.
- (ii) Reference was made to papers recently received from Sweet Trust for Nature.

5. Treasurer's Report (S. Bullock)

Income since last meeting (mostly subscription) was £159.50 and expenditure £102.18. Balance was £100.72.

7. Planning Matter

- (a) No observations had been made on plans for a small conservatory at Lynden Lea, Sutton Rd.
- (b) Consideration will be given to plans for "extensia" at Bartuff, M-H Lane.

- (c) Future events. Those planned by the Chairman are:

 - (ii) November - "Old Sutton Projects" - Ronnie Waite.

Other possibilities are - a talk on Salisbury cathedral by the master mason and on Kirkham by Night spring (Dorset Museum).

Maurice Morris suggested a garage sale at individual garages but this was considered unwise from a security viewpoint; however, Simon Cudlton will speak to Jim Collier about a car-boot sale on the pub car park during late September.

7. Planning (cont'd).

Development at Coast-Guard cottages, Bowclaze. Discussion took place on this matter about which the Chairman has corresponded with the C.P.O. It was left for individuals to offer any comments.

9. Other Business.

(a) Plant-holders Peter Jones referred again to R. Aggett of Cork Hill making these wooden holders at a cost of about £15, the profits going to Guide Dogs for the Blind.

(b) Richard Bachwell mentioned prolonged correspondence with Mr E. Brown and his descendants about an account at Lloyd's bank in the name of "Pewsey, Sutton Poyntz and Osmington Memorial Playing Field Fund". Joyce Leesley and others felt sure that this did not concern the Society but might perhaps have some connection with the church or Osmington Parish Council.
