

MINUTES

of Committee Meeting on 27 June 1995 at Haunton Lodge, Plaister Lane.
Tony Bugler in the chair; apologies from Clive Brown and Richard Wilcock.

1. Minutes of meeting on 30.5.95 read, approved and signed.

2. Matters arising:

(a) Traffici Callum. A meeting would be held with the Borough Bagillies on 5 July, with the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Ron Buck and Peter Jones attending (Secretary away on holiday); these members would meet privately to discuss the matter.

(b) Millennium Fund. Details had been received of the second round of applications, mostly for ^{very} expensive projects.

(c) B-in-B. The Chairman mentioned (a) the clearing of trees etc at the Sutton Rd/Huddleduck Lane junction; (b) repairs executed to notice frames - thanks expressed to Jack Holden-Wilkinson for his attention to the S.P.S. box; (c) entries for the children's painting competition. No date was yet known for the judging but Joyce Lisle said the Weymouth B-in-B Committee knew that a different judge from previous years would judge Sutton Regt. It was left to the Chairman and Simon Coulton to make necessary arrangements for general tidying up etc, working parties, judging route, and use of kids.

(d) Poorter etc Playing Field Mc: no member of the Committee had been able to unearth any firm details of this reported account, but the Secretary's contact with the Clerk of Durnham Parish Council suggested he might be able to assist. Richard Ackhurst would pursue his enquiries accordingly.

3. Chairman's Report (Tony Bugler).

(a) The resumed hearings regarding ^{WPBC} Structure Plan proposals would take place in November, although a press notice was not too clear.

(b) The "Broom Lane" - a newspaper report contended that there would be a delay in proceeding with this highway for financial reasons, even if the route were approved by the Secretary of State.

(c) Representations were made to him about the presence of bulls in

village fields; it was thought that there were beef bulls and thus not dangerous, but farmers have a duty to protect the public.

- (a) Archaeological Dig 1993/4. attempt would be made to pursue a suggestion by Fredy Kelsell that any old drawing of the earlier earthworks, hill, etc, might be made available.
- (c) World War Two casements. The Chairman would follow up suggestions that this work should qualify for a Civic Society award.

4. Treasurer's Report (Simon Bullock)

Subs received were £63.00 and sale of notebooks and cards £15.

Expenditure was £12.49. Cash at bank - £148.78 and in hand £17.45.

5. Planning matters.

- (i) Carlief, M.H. Lane - no objection raised to small extension
- (ii) Bungalow near Booley Corn Cottage, Puddledock Lane. - The C.P.O. had been informed that we had no comments to offer on this new development which was some way outside the Society's area; but a couple of members thought we should consider more carefully.

6. Social Activities.

- (i) The Walk - 18 members had enjoyed this delightful walk and 14 stayed for good light meals at the New Inn, West Kington, when Richard Backwell had been thanked for arranging it all. *
- (ii) Sorbet Cream Tarts in O.B. Lane were in hand. The Chairman and Ron Birch were liaising with Jim Willis over any requirements, assistance etc.
- (iii) Car-boot sale. Simon Bullock reported that the Springhead would welcome the use of its premises at any time.
- (iv) Barn-Dance 1996. It was agreed in principle to organise another barn dance in the Spring of next year.

7. A.O.B. On the suggestion of Maureen Morris it was agreed that more details be given in a Newsletter of members of the Committee and the areas they cover for subs, etc.
