

MINUTES

of meeting of the Committee on 8 January 1996 at 7.30 pm at Richard Bockwell's home. Tony Bagger in the chair. Apologies from Simon Caulkin & Peter Jones.

1. Minutes of meeting on 27.11.95 read, approved and signed

2. Matters arising

(i) Traffic Calming. Correspondence with S Morris (MPAC) read. He undertaken to consult with Direct C.C.

(ii) Britain in Moscow. Arrangements for meeting on 25.1.96 discussed.  
(The Brighton Mauswand speaker will address the meeting first).

The Chairman reported - (a) an ash tree has been planted by the Council at the Sutton Rd/Preston Rd junction; (b) the dead arrows have been buried. The Office of W.P.C. concerned consider that over the long term the trees need to be alternately removed to promote growth and avoid pollarding (for which they are not really suitable). The Committee accepted this advice.

- (iii) poop-scoop bin. This is being processed.
- (iv) "Brown Route" inquiry currently proceeding, attended as necessary by the Chairman and secretary. (for which expenses may be reimbursed).
- (v) Hedge, Plasterers Lane - not trimmed yet.

### 3. Chairman's Report

Noise from Russian Ships. Some villagers had complained about the noise from ships in the bay. While not unsympathetic, members felt the Society should not involve itself in this controversial matter.

- (d) Extensions at Cliffe, Plasterers Lane - plans to be examined.
