

MINUTES

of Committee meeting on 19 March 1996 at 7.30 pm. at Hampton Lodge. Mr A. Bugler in the chair (Mrs B. Gates attended)

1. Minutes of meeting on 6.2.96 were read, confirmed and signed.

2. Matters arising:

(a) Traffic calming - awaiting more information from W.P.D.C.

(b) Britain-in-Bloom. Simon Bullock was not present and there seemed nothing special to discuss.

(c) Drop scoop bin. This will be faced by the Chairman and son which by the wall opposite the information board by the pond. It was decided to proceed without formal planning consent but the Secretary will notify the C.O.C. Department.

(d) Tream Lane - result of Inquiry awaited - possibly several months' delay.

3. A.G.M. - Final details agreed. The S.P.S. banners to be displayed and tables to be provided, with posies and candles.

It was reported that Don Hrierley had agreed to serve on the committee and was expected to be Secretary, with typing etc. assistance from Ken Knight. The Chairman would speak to him briefly about membership.

4. Chairman's report.

(a) Drumington/Vorrell by-pass. A plan of ^{the} likely route for this by-pass at some unspecified future date had been obtained from Dorset C.C. The valley between Weston and Drumington would not be affected.

(b) A local firm would be contacting Ronnie Waite about making a video of his film about old Sutton layouts.

5. Secretary's report

(i) National Spring Clean event 12-21 April. More details had been sought from Tidy Britain Group.

(ii) Heels by the Pond. A letter from the Shires to W.P.B.C. was read - they wished to hear more evidence that the Council's proposed treatment was the best available. The Chairman had asked the Trees Officer of Dorset C.C. for his comments, and it was agreed that Richard Mach should ask Mike Shepherd (a former Trees Officer) for his comments.

(iii) Village lost-card. Noll Jatt, Mr. have been informed that

we do not desire any more cards at this stage, in response to their "one-off" offer. Cards will be on sale at the Village Fayre.

- (ii) Reference was made to newspaper reports on the result of the inquest last year into the "Western Route"; while legis and Local Plan areas remain notification is awaited.
- (iii) The committee will keep under review possible developments at the White Horse caravan site.
