

Minutes of the meeting of the Committee on Tues. 21st May 1996 at 7.30pm
at 'Old Stables'. Tony Bugler in the Chair.

(1) Apologies. Richard Backwell.

(2) Minutes of the meeting of 23rd April 1996 were read, approved
and signed.

(3) Matters arising

(i) Officers. Maureen Morris agreed to accept the post of
Social Secretary.

(ii) Traffic calming. A response had been received from the
Highways Agency Manager (letter of 13th May 96) and it was agreed that
he should be informed of the Committee's disappointment at
the lack of progress in bringing about any improvements.

(iii) Redecoration of the Sutton Room. The Chairman reported that
the Retorect members were going to carry out the work
on 1st June 1996. Mr. & Mrs. Norman Brown were prepared to
carry out preliminary cleaning work on 28th May
and a number of members agreed to help clean and
would report for duty at 10.0 am.

(iv) Britain-in-Bloom. Simon Embler reported that he
had received a good response to the offer of free plants
with over 80 already distributed. All the road side
flower boxes were in place and ready for planting. Work
was about to start to tidy up the area of the log at
the entrance to SP. Video production was in hand and
good progress was being made. The approximate date
for the judging was 15th July and Simon would be
organising the annual 'clean up' gang and contacting
the Council to seek their help. A decision on the route
to be followed by the judge would be taken nearer the time.

(v) Talk by Christopher Page. He has agreed to speak to the Society
and will be contacted in the Autumn to fix a date.

(vi) DNHAS. The membership of the Society has been

cancel.

- (vii) Summer Walk. Richard Backwell had had to change the venue and route and members were required to distribute corrections of the latest Newsletter.
- (viii) French Occasion. Communication difficulties had almost led to a breakdown of the extremely cordial with Mrs. Jacques Blame. Simon Embleton was appointed as plenipotentiary with fully delegated powers to re-establish diplomatic relations and to make arrangements for the event on 16th July.
- (ix) Teas on the lawn. Julie Allen and helpers had agreed to organise the event on 3rd August and the Sanders have kindly allowed the Society the use of their lawn for that day.
- (x) Talk by H. Jacques. Richard Need confirmed that this had now been arranged for 7.30pm 26th September 1996. Maureen Morris agreed to book the Sutton Room with Gilbert Randall.
- (xi) Talk by Brian Seale. Ken tonight agreed to contact him and invite him for 28th October.
- (xii) Christmas Evening. The Perfect Quire had offered to perform on 2nd or 5th December. Maureen Morris agreed to check on the availability of the Preston Village Hall before the Secretary confirmed the booking of the Quire. Following discussion it was decided to defer a decision on admission charges to a future meeting.
- (xiii) Root problems. Ken tonight reported that W.P.B.C Environmental Officer would not take any action against the roots but said that individuals could do so. Simon Embleton undertook to tell those residents who had asked the Society for advice.

4/ Chairman's report.

- (i) W.P.B.C had agreed to a request from the White Horse caravan Park to increase the number

of caravans but they must be contained within its existing boundaries.

(ii) Members were reminded of the need to collect prays for the Street Fayre stall. Prays should be deposited with Ron Birch.

(iii) Sutton Room. The possibility of obtaining development funds from the Lottery or Millennium Fund was introduced for discussion. The Secretary was asked to obtain more precise information about the various schemes to enable more meaningful discussions to take place.

(iv) Willows on the pond. The chairman has arranged to meet Mr. Paine of the DCC Planning Dept. to discuss the future treatment of the trees.

5/ Secretary's report.

C.P.R.E. It was agreed that the annual subscription of £8 shall be renewed.

6/ Treasurer's report.

As at 21st May 1996 there was a balance of £374-16 made up of £311-24 (bank at Bank) and £62-92 (bank in hand). Subscriptions were now due for collection.

7/ Planning matters.

(i) The Old Dairy House - Puddledock Lane.

Conversion of outbuilds to ancillary residential accommodation. The chairman believed that there were no problems with this application but would check the proposals.

(ii) Access off Sutton Road. A letter of 2nd May from the Chief Planning Officer enquired if there had been a long-established vehicular access from Sutton Road to the field. Members had no knowledge of such an access and the Secretary was asked to inform the CPO.

8/ AOB.

- (i) Street Laysure. Maureen Morris asked for the help of the Committee to sell programmes for the Laysure (A1 for programme). It was agreed to support.
- (ii) Future speakers. Peter Jones recommended Brian Pomeroy as an excellent speaker on military connectors in the context of Dorset. It was agreed that he should be considered for inclusion in the programme possibly for next Spring.
- (iii) Film of Old Dorset. Simon Embley recommended a programme and it was agreed that it would be suitable for a future AGM.
