

Minutes of the meeting of the Committee on Tues. 4th Feb 1997 at Suttun Lodge. Tony Bugler in the Chair.

- (1) Apologies were received from Richard Backwell and Christine Gates.
- (2) The minutes of the meeting of 3rd Dec 1996 were read, approved and signed.
- (3) Matters arising:
 - (i) Ships bell. Peter Jones reported that the repurposed bell and bracket would be mounted in time for the AGM to be held on 17th April in the Suttun Room.
 - (ii) Neighbourhood Watch scheme. The Secretary passed on the apologies of PC Rich O'Shea for not supplying

the necessary information leaflets for Marion Morris and Ron Bird to distribute to their neighbours. Mr O'Sullivan had promised to deliver these in the near future.

(13) Social events.

(a) The Secretary reported that PC O'Sullivan and Shirley Rose had informed that they would speak to the Society on 25th March and 17th April respectively. It was agreed that there would not be a raffle at the PC O'Sullivan meeting and that there would be a yearlist 'Chinese' raffle at the Shirley Rose meeting which would be organised by Peter Jones. (b) Future meetings. The following possibilities were discussed but no dates agreed:- (i) Colin Povey on military sites in Dorset (ii) Terry Henry on Old Mary Rose (iii) Walfred Weld on family connections with Sutton Point and (iv) the DSEI jobs promoted by the Society to speak about the experience of their expeditions.

(iv) Cleaning of the pond. The Secretary reported that Mr. Gribble of W PBC had confirmed in a telephone conversation that the pond would be cleared out before the Spring. Marion Morris had also spoken with W PBC officers and had been assured that action will be taken.

(v) The Secretary reported that he had written to the SGB about overhead power cables but had not received a reply.

(4) Planning.

(i) Application for permission to refurbish other cottages off Sutton Rd and to erect an extension at the Dining House, Puddledock Lane were noted and no objections were raised.

(ii) The Planning authority's objections that had been lodged against a retrospective application for permission to provide a vehicular access to a field at the junction of Sutton Rd and Parson Rd. Miles Meek confirmed that a number of objections had been made and work to a

considered by the Planning Committee on the day following this meeting.

(iii) Erection of a horse shelter off Winstow Rd. This application had been refused by WPBC but the Chairman reported that an alternative site was under consideration in the field behind Winslow Rd and it was felt that the Society should not object to the proposal. This view was supported by the Committee.

(5) Chairman's report.

(i) Suttor Room and adjacent cottages. The PCC had recommended that the cottages and land on the rear should be sold and that the ~~Suttor~~ Suttor Room should be ~~rehabilitated~~ refurbished. Other planning permission was to be sought for a development of the land at the rear. Following further discussion it was agreed that Ken Triggle should seek to set up a joint meeting with the PCC and representative of the SPS Committee to examine the long-term use and future of the Suttor Room. KK would speak back at the next meeting.

(ii) Joyce Letali was asked to report on a meeting about Britain in Bloom held in Weymouth which had decided to back Weymouth's entry into the National Competition. It was likely that sponsorship would be sought and asked whether the Society would be prepared to ~~agree~~ do this. Following a lengthy discussion it was decided not to take any action until more information about costs and maintenance was available.

(6) Secretary's report.

(a) Correspondence.

(a) Britain in Bloom. A letter seeking support in terms of membership of 'Friends of B in B' was read out. Membership for the Society would be £250 and for individuals £25. It was agreed not to support this appeal.

(b) Letters of thanks from the two DfE girls for the Society's sponsorship were noted.

(c) Beach clean - 2nd April. Details were read out.

(d) Council and the Community. Letter of 6th Jan 1997 asking if the Society was interested in joining in open discussions with Council Members and Officers was discussed. It was agreed that the Society would support such an initiative.

(e) Traffic calming. In response to an enquiry from Bla Gwyn, the Secretary explained that the exchange of letters with Councillor Weare was on-going but real progress was not being made because of financial considerations and split responsibility between District and County Councils. It was agreed that the matter should not be allowed to loiter and that the next Newsletter should encourage residents to keep pressurising the local councillors about the various dangers on Plasfor's Lane and Sutton Rd.

(7) Treasurer's report

The closing balance as at 8th Feb 1997 was £4 89-09 made up of £434-20 cash at bank and £54-89 cash in hand. ~~Details~~ of the accounts were deposited with the Secretary.

(8) AOB

(ii) Agenda 21. Following a question from Miles Penry, Peter Jones said that he would enquire about any developments.

(iv) Tony Bayler announced his intention to stand down as chairman after the next AGM. At the request of the Committee he agreed to reconsider this decision.
