

Minutes of the AGM 17th April 1997.

Held at 7.30pm in the Sutton Room with Tony Bayle in the chair and 57 members in attendance.

Before the meeting the chairman unveiled the ship's bell of HMS Bandit that had been mounted on the pier-gate. A few words of him as a gesture of thanks were received from Mrs. Mrs. J. Reynolds, Christine Gale, Mr. & Mrs. Tebbitt, Mrs. Grayde, Mrs. Givley, Mrs. Hackford, Mrs. Tantlin and Mrs. Wayhorn.

2/ The minutes of the AGM of 16th April 1996 were read, approved and signed.

3/ Matters arising - taken up under items 4 or 5.

4. Chairman's report.

The Chairman announced that he would be standing down after serving for five years - & that his successor would be Mike Pashley. He followed this by a brief resume of the Society's activities during his period of office. In particular he drew the attention of the members to:

- a) Planning and development matters. The Society had continued to play an important rôle in making its views known by attending at and by letter and comment to public inquiries and examinations in public of the Town and the County Structure plans, the Rochester road survey, Footpath preservation and individual planning applications. There was a regular line of communication established in particular with the Weymouth and Portland Planning Department. He considered the most satisfying outcome of the Society's endeavours to be the ~~final~~ refusal of planning permission to develop a large housing estate in the valley below Shalbury.

- b) Britain-in-Bloom. Although a decision had been taken not to enter the competition for 1997 he felt the the efforts of the village in the past few years, when the runner-up position had been secured on three occasions, was worthy of comment and in particular he paid tribute to the effort of Dorothy and Lynn Embler who had spearheaded the village's attempt to win the top award.

- c) Social events. The ongoing programme of talks, concert teas, Summer walk, Christmas events and Barn dance continued to be successful and generally well-supported.

- d) Other activities. The Society had given active and practical support to the two Victorian Street Fayres that had been held during his chairmanship and had been particularly successful in raising large sums on

the Tombola stall. Recently the Society gave a small sponsorship to two local girls to help them complete their D of E Gold award. The expenditure consisted of a suitcase sent from Dakar to the Agones. The two girls will speak to the Society on 22nd May about their experiences.

At the close of the report John Hatchford proposed a vote of thanks to the Chairman for his dedicated and successful work over the past four years. This was seconded by Ron Burd and duly approved. In addition Joyce Litschi ~~for~~ on behalf of the Committee presented the Chairman with a small gift in appreciation of his work for the Society.

~~5/ Secretary's report.~~ Road calming measures. An outline of the correspondence between the Society and W.P.B.C. officials and councillors was given and members were requested to keep up the pressure on an individual basis to ensure that the problems of Plaister Lane and Sutton Rd were not forgotten by those in office. Reference was also made to the proposal to set up a 'Community meeting' at which members would have the opportunity to question officials and councillors about issues like traffic calming and planning policy.

6/ Treasurer's report.

Simon Embler presented the audited accounts for the year ending 31/3/97. There was £2243.51 in the National Savings A/c and £424.55 in the Bank in petty cash. On the motion of Ken Knight, duly seconded, the accounts were approved and subscriptions fixed at £2 per household or £1 for persons living alone.

7/ Committee membership.

It was agreed that new nominees had been received and the new committee were proposed to serve again. It was agreed by acclamation that the present committee should continue in office.

8/ AOB.

a) Mrs. Wynne-Wilson proposed that members should try to encourage neighbours to join the Society to ensure its long-term future. There was a general acceptance of this suggestion.

b) Mrs. Audrey McBrady suggested that a name-plate should be provided for the River Gordon. The discussion that followed ~~was~~ illustrated that there was some doubt about the course of the river. Freddy Litchi informed that the Gordon did not flow down Silver St. at Sutton Rd (opposite the Bull Inn) but joined the stream at the bridge near Puddledock Lane. There was a general acceptance that a sign at the appropriate place would be of interest but no formal proposal was made.

The meeting closed at 8.05 pm.

Following the AGM. Mr. Blantyre Poxe gave a fascinating account of his family's place in the history of Dorset including the branch of the family that had lived in Sutton Bury until earlier this century. The chairman proposed a vote of thanks to Mr. Poxe and this was warmly supported by the members.

A novelty 'Chinese' raffle organised by Pete Jones raised over £40 for the Society.
