

Minutes of the meeting of the Committee on Tues. 17<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1988 at 'The Past'. Mike Pashby in the chair.

- (1) Apologies - Richard Bachwell, Joyce Letchie, Alan Sharp
- (2) The minutes of the meeting of 15<sup>th</sup> October were read, approved & signed
- (3) Matters arising:

(a) Telephone test. The Secretary reported that BT had informed that the test was scheduled for operating in the Spring/Summer of 1989.

(b) Footpaths. Paul de Carteret had been informed of the problems and would take up the matter with the appropriate people. It was agreed that an item should be included in the next Newsletter exhorting residents to use the footpaths around the village so that they would not fall into disuse.

(c) Village appraisal. There was a general discussion about the nature of the Milton Abbas questionnaire and its relevance to Saltash Royal. The concept of a village appraisal for St. I was questioned, given that the village did not have a parish council. PJ produced a document he had obtained from the Brentwood Commission which gave clear guidelines on the suitability of an appraisal for a place like St. I. It was agreed that PJ should obtain more copies for members to study to enable them to come to a fully-informed decision on whether to proceed with an appraisal. If the committee decided to go ahead, it was essential that ~~the more~~ the whole village must be involved and that the process would have to be carefully managed by an effective <sup>group</sup> committee will the necessary skills to organise the appraisal.

At the chairman's suggestion, a small sub-committee of RM, PJ & MJ would collect committee member views once they had read the CC report and if there was

support for the proposal, arrangements would be put in hand to call a village meeting, at which the proposal to seek the necessary backing for the proposal. There would be a point in presenting without the enthusiastic support of the community. It was also agreed that inquiries should be carried out to check whether St. Paul's church established a parish council.

(d) Sutton Room. A business plan had been developed and it was agreed that it would soon be possible to make application for grant aid.

(e) Millennium celebrations. Tony Bayly reported on the discussions that had been held with representatives of the WI and the Steel Band Committee. The following suggestions had been made:-

(i) a montage of old photographs. (ii) a Millennium book which villages would be invited to join and be given opportunity (iii) a bonfire at midday followed by a torchlight procession. (iv) a street plague or smelly mixture (TB had spoken to Mr. Goffe who was prepared to donate an appropriate mix of stonewash). (v) old photo exhibit (vi) tree planting, (vii) a large Christmas tree (viii) a music festival monthly using the local band, Melrose and the future Ma-Simpson (ix) the production of souvenirs - Leonard Hall, had been consulted and the suggestion was received to develop the project. (x) sergeant major held by the Society.

The Chairman asked TB to carry on his discussions and to report back with a number of firm recommendations. The Committee agreed in principle to provide financial support for the above projects. Most members were enthusiastic about a tree sowing at the entrance to St. Paul's on Sutton Rd.

(f) Speakers - Feb. 1999.

Telluric inquiries it was decided not to invite either the Govt. of H.M.R. or of H.M.T. directly to speak to the Society. Instead inquiries would be made about the availability of Mr. T. Tame of H.M.T. The Queen. Given a satisfactory answer, the Secretary should invite Mr. Tame to speak about life in a modern prison.

4) Planning. RM reviewed the current applications.

- (a) 32, Sutton Rd. - alterations & extension at the rear of the house.
  - no objections were raised.
- (b) The Barn appeal. The Inspector's decision was still awaited. Tony B. had heard a rumour that WPC Planning Dept had failed to forward all the letters of local residents to the Inspector. The Chairman agreed to check this story.
- (c) The changes proposed at the Lady Inn had been carried out.
- (d) retrospective planning permission to install a window at 'The Mill' had been granted.

There followed a discussion about the state of Manor Farm Cottages, and RM agreed to carry out further investigations.

A letter from Mr. M. Doyle addressed to the Chairman about the changes at 'The Mill' was read out by RM together with the Chairman's reply. It was agreed that the Committee should not take any further action in this matter.

The Chairman ~~said~~ commented on the rear building on White Horse Lane which seemed much larger than the one on the planning application. The Society had not objected to the original application but had only expressed concern about the building size and the materials. He felt that the <sup>numbers of the</sup> Planning sub-committee of the Society should familiarise themselves with the regulations and guidelines on such items as listed buildings and conservation areas and that all future applications should be more carefully scrutinised to ensure that the finished building ~~is~~ is as envisaged in the planning application.

5) Social. Christmas Party 8-9pm Fri. 11<sup>th</sup> Dec in the Sutton Room. MM. has put in place the arrangements and confirmed that entertainment would be provided by this Galpin's pantomime troupe. Members were asked to provide mince pies. It was agreed that there should be an alternative change of plan. There would be a cheese raffle organised by PJ as he was authorised

to buy paper up to £30. Publicity would be given to the event in the next newsletter and by slips delivered to households.

6) Treasurer's report. There was an opening balance of £402.42 on 17/11/98. Income of £24.03 and expenditure of £66.75 leaving a closing balance of £400.70 - £318 cash at bank and £142.29 cash in hand.

## 7) AOB.

a) Water Heater - Sutton Room. TB raised the issue of the provision of water heaters by the Society. MP reminded him of the previous decision to await the outcome of the discussions <sup>about</sup> ~~about~~ concerning the conversion of the Sutton Rm. into a village hall before committing any expenditure.

b) Weymouth Civic Society. R. Boil as the Soc. representative reported on the AGM which had been held on Mon. 16<sup>th</sup> November. Awards had been made for developments at (i) the Captain's House - Prittle (ii) The Royal Hotel, and (iii) Rectory Hall. He had paid the affiliation fee on behalf of the Society. He felt that in future it would be helpful if an officer of COSSPS could attend future meetings of the WSC.

c) Stone plant - White Horse Lane. RM asked whether anyone had looked at this. A number of members commented that it had been erected by Mr. Young to warn drivers not to encroach any further down the lane. It was not a hazard or an eyesore and it was agreed that no action should be taken by the Society.

d) Environmental Partnership - WPBC. PJ would be attending as the Society's representative on 18<sup>th</sup> Nov.

e) Willow around the pond. MM commented on the latest removal of a tree which she felt had been badly carried out.

f) Soap cans on the supplementary car-park of the Greyfriars. S.T. was asked to have a word with Peter Smith to see if they could be removed.

g) Seminar on the future of transport in WSP - 27<sup>th</sup> Nov. The Secretary would provide details if any member was interested in attending.
