

Minutes of the meeting of the SPS Committee held on Monday
9th Oct. at John Allen's house, Joyce Street in the evening.

- 1) Apologies. Several people on Rishworth Mead.
- 2) Minutes of the meeting of 19th July were read, approved and signed.
- 3) Matters arising,
 - a) The pond. Mr Forrest was concerned that the water coming out by DNT on the banks of the pond were acting as filter causing elements to build up within the

wards with certainty, until a statement of CC with GLA. It had been a short while at the time of the Green Team event and I felt that the full members were in decline. It suggests that CC with work should now be dismantled. It was agreed to contact DWT to seek advice but many members felt that the structure should be left in place for a number of years. Galvin Allen would contact someone from DWT to raise the issue with him.

3) The Millennium Season: Although it has been agreed at CC that nothing will be taken any action to provide support for the possible re-creation of the Green Club but this should be the job Board. Tony Sugden asked for CC to be re-considered. After a long discussion the chairman decided to put a motion to a vote and in his capacity as GLA, CC proposed to provide funds towards the by-laws and such a vote was deferred.

4) The Greyhead, MM, was concerned that P.W. Smith, the outgoing chairman, had applied for a full entertainment licence only weeks before his departure. He felt that the new levels of society money, would be needed in the days of the week. The Committee would set up a check on developments.

5) Subscriptions and lists of members.

7) Treasurer's report.

a) As at 9/10/2000 there was an opening balance of £239-61, income of £494-50 and expenditures of £140-82, leaving a total of £592-79 (£513-21 at the bank and £79-58 cash in hand).

b) It was also agreed by the Committee that S.E. D8 and J.L. should be the authorized signatories on behalf of the Society.

c) The Chairman reported on a donation of £250 from Mr. Jacobs of Waterside Caravans. At his suggestion ~~the~~ and fully supported by the members this sum was donated to the Marine Hall Management Committee funds. J.L. had written to Mr. Jacobs for his generous gift.

8) AOB

a) The Chairman advised how much had been donated by the Street Fayre etc to the Marine Hall fund. He was informed that only £1500 had been given.

b) Traffic survey. K.K. wondered what had happened to the data. John Allen believed that details had been passed to Mr. Penny of WPBC. It was felt that an item should be included in the next Newsletter.

c) Artefacts donated by Mr. Poyntz displayed in the Springfield. The Chairman had approached the outgoing landlord to ask if they could be handed back to the Committee. He had not agreed unless told to do so.

- d) Play areas on the millennium oak trees. The Secretary was asked to check with Simon Cumpton whether he had ordered them.
- e) David Emery pointed out that one of the oak trees was in very poor condition. The Secretary agreed to contact the DCC Tree Officer to ask for his assistance.
- f) Park in Bloom. The Secretary reported that the C & B-S competition literature had been received. It was agreed that the SPS would not be entering this year.
- g) Roulston Rd near Th. Lane. The recurring damage to the road surface was raised by Michael Haine. Th and VT pointed out that in spite of numerous requests to tackle the real problem of draining off surface water, the council's only response was to do a patch-up job. JL was not hopeful that the work would be carried out satisfactorily.
- h) Red squirrel appeal by DNT - It was agreed that a donation of £25 should be made to this appeal.
- i) Merlin Hall lane. A copy of a letter sent by Mrs. Mrs. Buckley of Yarrowia Cottage to the Highways Dept. asking for the lane to be made 'access only' was read out by MM. It was agreed that the Secretary should write to the Highways Dept. in support of Mrs. & Mrs. Buckley's proposal.

- j) Rubbish bin - problem. MM reported that Dave Sally was prepared to make a container with a lid to stop the rubbish in the green bin being spread about by the roots. Before asking DC to do this, the Society was asked to contact WPDCL to ask them to provide a suitable container.
- k) Sign post at the top of Plasterers Lane. The Society was asked to contact the WPBC to ask them to erect a village name sign. Some members felt there would be difficulties about this as the entrance to Sutton Park is actually in WDCL.
- l) Millennium Book signed 5 villages. PJ asked who had offered it. TB believed that it was being held by Norma Brown in readiness to be put on display once the Marin Hall was refurbished.
- m) Dorset Book competition. The chairman thought that a Village Survey should be entered for the competition. The Society was asked to send a copy to the organisers.
- n) White lines at the end of Plasterers Lane: TB reported that these had worn out and needed repainting. The Society to speak with WPBC.
