

Minutes of the meeting of the SPS Committee held on  
Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November at Alan Simpson's house.

- 1) Apologies. Simon Lambkin, Vic Farrant, Glenda Davis
- 2). Minutes of the meeting of 9<sup>th</sup> Oct were read, approved and signed.

- 3) Matter arising

- a) Pollution of the pond. Glenda Allen reported that she had discussed the issue raised by Vic Farrant at the last meeting. However Bruce had told her that Vic's worries were unjustified. Glenda went on to say that a group of school children had analysed the water of the garden and to her surprise had reported that the oxygen content was very low. It was agreed to defer any further discussion for six months.

- (1) Search for the AGM. K.K. arranged that Mr Roy Adam would be the guest speaker at the AGM on 12<sup>th</sup> April.
- (2) Traffic survey. The Secretary confirmed that a copy had been sent to Mr. Lenny (WPBC) for research purposes.
- (3) David Wyn-Wilson reported that the pictures given to the village by Bob Poyntz were still on display in the Springfield and that the new landlord was aware that they were not the property of the pub.
- (4) Playas on oak trees. The Secretary had spoken to Dennis Lumbler who had confirmed that he intended to commission the work.
- (5) Location of the new oak trees. The Secretary reported that the arrangements contracted with DCC to maintain the trees for two years were still operative. Mr. Danny Allen of DCC was the office responsible.
- (6) Red squirrel appeal to DWT. The Secretary advised that a donation of £25 had been made.
- (7) Subsidy for new telepond. Mr. David Lawyer, the office responsible at WPBC had promised to provide a bin well a cover some time in the early spring.
- (8) Sign on Plaster Lane. The Secretary had written to Mr. G. Blakada (Highways Dept. DCC) asking him to arrange for a sign to be provided.
- (9) White lines - Presidian Lane. Mr. Lenny (WPBC) had promised to have these repainted.
- (10) Seminar on renewable energy. The Society had been represented by Julian Allen at the meeting which was held at Weston Village Hall. The organisers (<sup>(ETEU)</sup>) were disappointed by the turnout (3 people) and felt that it reflected the lack of interest in Dorset where only two schemes were in operation compared to over 20 in Cornwall. It was significant that not one from the Council attended.

4) Fish in the pond. The Chairman reported that a local resident had offered to donate a sack of fish. Name Brown had given to the reporter and had said for the fish to arrive the assault - the donor had suggested the fish be placed in the pond. Members with a long experience of studying the well-being of fish in the pond informed the attempts had been made in the past to grow fishes but they had failed because of the flow of water through the pond. The Secretary was asked to speak to Mr - Brown and explain the problem but ask him to pass on the details of the damage to the person who had offered the fish.

#### 5) Planning

a) R.M. reported that Mrs. Shine had appealed successfully against the Council decision not to grant planning permission for an extension. It was surprising that no representative of the Council was present when the inspector made his site visit. It was agreed not to write to the Council to complain about the absence of the responsible officer as it was understood that he had already been reprimanded.

b) Local exports Miller's Bluff. The Chairman reported that this had been bought by Mr. Porte who had carried out a full improvement scheme that had caused concern <sup>because</sup> ~~that~~ some local residents feared that the land was being prepared for development. Enquiries had been made and planning permission was not being sought by the new owner.

#### 6) Social matters

a) M.M. reported the arrangements for the coffee break party on 5<sup>th</sup> Dec. He asked for

help to decorate the Mission Hall on 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec. (P.J. & M.H.) volunteers) and for helpers on 5<sup>th</sup> Dec at 10-0 a.m. to set up the tables. A raffle would be organised and members should bring prizes on the day. P.J. would try to be available to organise it but if he was unavailable the Secretary agreed to stand in.

6) 21<sup>st</sup> Dec. Band Service around a Christmas Tree. There was some confusion about who would be responsible for organising this event. The Society had agreed to buy the tree but no other commitments had been made. M.M. agreed to raise the money at the next Mission Hall Management Committee meeting. T.B. was able to obtain a tree at a reasonable rate but would await the meeting of the M.H.M.C.

7). It was suggested that Richard Backwell should be invited to give a talk about Mont St. Clare sometime in the Lent Term. The Secretary was asked to contact Richard about this.

7) Treasurer's report. There was no report as the T. ~~had~~ was not present.

8) AOB.

a) Congratulations were expressed to Lucy Emery for a Weymouth Civic Society award she had received for a research project on a blue-spotted butterfly. This would be put in the next Newsletter.

b) An award had also been made to the owner of <sup>In the works</sup> Mayfield Farm cottage.

c) There was a rumour afoot that the field next to the Longhouse was for sale. The Secretary was asked

to make enquiries.
